We are Ben & Alysha Godfrey of Cameron, TX USA. Ben and I own a sustainable farm in Milam County, TX. We provide food directly to about 250 families through varied food products produced on our farm. We provide indirectly to another 1000+ through our aquaponic and field vegetables via wholesale means of supplying larger Consumer Supported Agriculture operations that make food available direct to consumer in Dallas and Austin, TX. We also offer diverse training experiences in the different areas of our farming for young adults who wish to learn more about sustainable farming, aquaponics, pastured poultry and pastured pork, grass based dairy and beef, organic produce farming, customer service, a creamery with commercial kitchen, and learning to milk cows.

We became acquainted with Tim and Susanne through their Friendly Aquaponic Commercial Aquaponic manual. Truthfully, it is one of the best and most exciting farming techniques we have been introduced to in the 12 years we have been farming.

We built 3 aquaponic facilities before we ever met Tim Mann, and through only the purchase of his book, he answered at least 160 emails from our aquaponic manager. In the course of generously answering the enormous amounts of emails, he saved us at least \$10,000 per aquaponic greenhouse on construction cost alone.

Amazing, who does that these days?! It has been so wonderful to be able to have the materials ready for class and pay for them as we use them. Not only that, they provided us with all of the

support material for free as well as the entire power point presentation so that our class would be the same material as all the other worldwide instructors. Then each time I send a payment, I get this very thankful note from Susanne, saying how much we have blessed them in sending them a check or a PayPal. It is nice to be told you brightened someone else's day but even nicer when you have brightened one another's.

Recently Tim flew to Texas to teach a Commercial Aquaponics course, hosted by our farm. Tim stayed in one of our bunkhouses for almost 2 weeks. He had every meal with us, worked with us, provided insight to our aquaponic systems for improvements, and taught us non-stop at no charge. He fairly divided up the course income and shared the expenses with us on everything. The participants had healthy meals, a clean environment to learn and a dedicated trainer. We saw him time and time again give free advice, ride off with fellow aquaponic enthusiasts to review their operation, free of charge, and just help in anyway possible. We found having Tim in our home a pleasant experience. He was mild mannered, helpful, independent, and in general just fit in.

We know about the offence for which they will be in front of you to review. My letter is mostly to tell you that we know from first hand experience that Tim has changed our lives in a positive way, that he helped people in TN and in TX have the opportunity to make a better life for themselves and their families by helping others and by providing food to others. 

I am writing this letter in order to inform you what my experience has been when dealing with both Tim Mann and Susanne Friend.

I began to move to Hawaii in January of 2009 with the plan of entering the field of farming. Not knowing much about farming it took me about a year before I meet Tim Mann who was starting, and by then running an aquaponics farm. The process intrigued me, I soon met another person who was also interested and we created a partnership and began to develop an aquaponics farm focused on growing strawberries. Tim and Susanne both made it clear that what we were trying was different from what they were doing, that was growing leafy greens. We plowed ahead anyways.

I will not bore you with the details but three years latter and 130,000 dollars we shut the farm down. During this time both Tim and Susanne were unbelievably helpful, they would give freely with both their time and knowledge, usually I would just stop by their house, unannounced, to ask questions, and they routinely stopped what they were doing and would answer my questions and give me their advice. They did this while being under extreme financial stress, and never asked for any financial compensation for their time or knowledge. Our relationship evolved from one of a student, teacher to one more as aquaponic coworkers sharing the knowledge we gained from our experiences. They were not the only people I tried to get help from, I called UC Davis, the center of strawberry research in the United States if not the world. I got better help from Tim and Susanne than UC Davis.

During this time our relationship evolved into one of friendship. I consider both of them to be good friends, I believe they are an asset to the community and would hate to lose them from our community. I hope you will see clear to some sort of penalty which will keep them in our community. I do not wish to belittle what they have done. I merely plead that removing them from our community would not be a benefit to the community, to society in general, or to their family.

#### To The Honorable Judge Leslie Kobayashi:

In October of 2012 my wife, Leslie Sears, and I attended a multi-day Aquaponics workshop by Tim Mann and Susanne Friend at their farm near Honoka'a. We had never met them previously but had read about Aquaponics as a farming technique and were subscribing to their newsletter. It is an alternative farming technique with many pluses for any area with limited or restricted resources to produce high-quality abundant produce for market.

We were interested in the possibilities of this method to grow our own food and, perhaps, as an additional income source as I am planning to retire soon from my position as a Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Analyst for the County of Hawai'i Planning Department. My wife is a self-employed graphic artist, printing, and self-publishing specialist running Les is More Printing & Graphics, here in Hilo where we live. Her clients include individuals, small businesses, and large corporations such as Nissan North America. We both work with community-based groups; Leslie is on the Board of Directors of the Hilo Downtown Improvement Association and is a "Vision-Keeper" for the Envision Downtown Hilo 2025 (EDH2025) committee. I serve on the Planning Department Mobility Solutions committee for EDH2025 and am an active member of Malama Kaipalaoa working on the clean up of the historic Kaipalaoa Landing area where the Wailuku River meets Hilo Bay.

While the Aquaponics workshop was professionally conducted and the information was clear, concise, and proven in concept, the real take-away from the week we spent on their farm and around their family was their devotion not only to this method of farming, but to their family, the land, and the people of this island. The happiness of their children and the obvious love they shared was an absolute pleasure to observe.

If Tim and Susanne found themselves pressed for income to service the loans they had taken, perhaps too optimistically supposing their farming methods would provide a rapid financial reward, they are not alone in letting passion trump judgment. The land has a mortgage, the equipment and supplies of their agricultural enterprise is a capital expense, raising children always demands new and usually unexpected expenses be paid out, and so on. It is easy to get behind, especially if you are plowing new ground in a new technology and learning by doing.

Roger Christie offered relief that could effectively save their situation. Neither of us second-guess them for accepting. What we can attest to is our impression of Tim and Susanne as people: they are honest, hard-working, and compassionate individualists. Marijuana is increasingly mainstream despite decades of illegality. It seems clear, with a casual glance at the daily news, a trend is underway to re-think the prohibition of marijuana.

It is under this atmosphere of tolerance and acceptance that Roger Christie was permitted to openly market marijuana for years in Hawai'i. It is little wonder Tim and Susanne could be persuaded to participate in growing marijuana for Mr Christie to distribute as a "sacrament." The local powers-that-be allowed the practice to persist, effectively signaling tolerance to anyone associated with Mr Christie's Cannabis Ministry.

Tim and Susanne did mention as part of the workshop that this growing technique was inappropriate for the requirements of marijuana growing and if that was the interest of any of the attendees, they were not going to learn anything useful. No one left or expressed disappoint at this news. Clearly, their audience is separate from that crowd.

We do not believe Tim and Susanne would have engaged in a marijuana-growing experiment without this combination of circumstances. We are very sure they will not jeopardize their family's welfare and their important work developing Aquaponic technologies ever again. Intelligent people learn from their mistakes and, hopefully, may be allowed to move on. In the course of their marijuana-growing experiment Tim and Susanne were apparently unable to effectively produce marijuana, nobody was hurt, and the only victims are themselves, and by association, their children. They have been punished to the extent they have learned their lesson and that should be enough to satisfy the law. To further incarcerate them would be punishing their children and serve no good to society. On this, Leslie and I are absolutely sure.

Thank you for taking the time to read our letter. In the spirit of justice and common decency, we exhort you to show compassion and leniency to Tim Mann and Susanne Friend. Restore them to their family and to their good work in helping provide an alternative to commercial agricultural practices through Aquaponics; the work they do is important and should not be overshadowed by a lapse of judgment for which they have, in our eyes, adequately atoned themselves. Please allow this issue to come to a close without further negative ramifications to Tim and Susanne, their family, and their business.

Dear Judge Kobayashi:

First let me introduce myself: I am a licensed acupuncturist practicing in Waimea on the Big Island for over twenty years. I have also taught on a private basis hundreds of Waimea's children in mathematics at the elementary through college level during that time period, as well as having been a teacher of acupuncture and Chinese traditional medicine at a school founded by Dr. Angela Longo, Ph.D.

I am well-known and respected in this community, I love Hawaii and the Big Island, and am an avid supporter of sustainable options in agriculture, energy, and many different healing modalities.

In the near future you will be presiding over the sentencing of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend for marijuana-related offenses. I would like to say a few things concerning the character and importance to the community of this married couple, whom I have known personally for 15 years.

I taught Susanne at the Traditional Chinese Medical College of Hawaii in the years 1998-2000. She was an avid student of acupuncture at that time and I remember her as being a very conscientious student and hard-working single mother.

She married Tim Mann, a local Honokaa businessman and accomplished construction draftsman, and she concentrated her efforts on raising her family and helping Tim found an aquaponics venture specializing in teaching others sustainable aquaponic agriculture, with contacts worldwide.

They undertook a project involving the feasibility of growing medical marijuana aquaponically under the auspices of a minister, Roger Christie, who persuaded them to grow marijuana for his church. Mr. Christie operated "The Hawaii Cannabis Ministry" on the Big Island for almost ten years, with the apparent knowledge of both local and federal authorities, and claimed First Amendment protection for his activities with marijuana. Their research efforts ultimately demonstrated the impracticality of this deep culture method for growing medicinal marijuana.

They regret their decision to grow marijuana deeply but their motives should be considered in their sentencing. This is not a simple case of cultivating marijuana to become large-scale suppliers for the illegal drug trade. There are no signs of a history of criminal activity in their past, they are productive members of the Big Island community, and they are excellent parents.

It would be a great misfortune for the island agricultural community to lose their input and expertise in these upcoming crucial years when more than at any time in the history of the Hawaiian Islands we need creative business people to move us in the direction of sustainable development.

The grievous effect of an adverse sentence on their children weighs heavily on their minds, above all other considerations.

Kindly keep these considerations in mind when you sentence  $\operatorname{Tim}$  Mann and  $\operatorname{Susanne}$  Friend.

Re: Tim Mann and Susanne Friend, Friendly Aquaponics

I am 85 years of age and retired. In the past, I was an International sales director for two firms in Miami, Florida and my last salaried job started at age 70 as an Adjunct Professor at America's largest community college, Miami-Dade Community College in Miami, Florida. I am a veteran of WW II, having served in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division. My father served in WW I, and my two uncles served in WW II. One was on duty at the naval hospital in Honolulu on December 7, 1941. My family has centuries of service, with the farm in Southern Georgia being part of the first GI Bill, a land grant in the wilderness of South Georgia after the Revolution. I realize that does not reflect on my character, but I was honored when my son stated that the greatest thing he ever learned was "character" from me. That son, who served in the U.S. Army in the early 70s, is a hospitalist at the Duke satellite hospital in Raleigh, NC. For several years, he was their Administrator of Hospitalists. My other son is a successful advertizing entrepreneur in San Diego, CA. I mention my sons because marijuana can destroy lives. I am not expressing an opinion about legality, I am thinking of the results of judicial decisions. Both my sons would have been jailed had they been charged by the local police when picked up as teenage violators of the law. Their future would have been totally different. Social Services are necessary but are not the best way to raise children. My understanding indicates that the children separated from their parents will be changed forever. I urge you to consider these points. My life as a single parent, my family, and the great benefits society has received from the work of my two boys would never have occurred had the police charged my sons.

Early last year, I started researching aquaponics for my daughter, who will retire soon. In the course of the research, I encountered Friendly Aquaponics. I recently recommended to the Departments of Health in Trinidad/Tobago and St. Maarten, and to contacts in India, where over 750,000 people die annually from malaria, to consult with Friendly Aquaponics for guidance in using aquaponics to control mosquitoes. The arrival in the West Indies of African diseases may find a solution in the Friendly Aquaponics discovery in Hawaii when combined with other common steps to eliminate mosquitoes that cause dengue fever, malaria, yellow fever, elephantiasis, and West Nile disease around the world. I mention these factors only to show the real world effect of their work and observations. Tim and Susanne's discovery may have a major impact on the world's health.

During my contact with this family, I have had no negative experience but have observed total commitment to helping people improve their lives. People can change. My sons changed. From my contact with Tim Mann and Susanne Friend, I believe they understand their error and will not make that mistake again. Every indication is they have suffered greatly and will continue to suffer.

# The Complete Biogas Handbook

Your Honor,

I am David House, the author of The Complete Biogas Handbook, Wind and Windspinners, and Journey (a book of poetry). The Biogas Handbook has been a standard reference in the field of small-scale anaerobic digestion, through three editions, for 30 years, and it was featured in The Whole Earth Catalog. Norman Cousins, late editor of the Saturday Review, praised my poetry and requested to meet with me. I hold a patent for the ultrasonic electrical stimulation of the cochlea to achieve a sensation of hearing. I have been very happily married for 37 years, and have three strong and happy children. (My daughter, for example, is living in the Dominican Republic. She is employed to provide distance learning via the Internet at the university level to a persecuted religious minority in Iran; she has established a local lending library with more than 3,000 books; and she works locally with issues of education and literacy.) As far as I can recall, I never once told my children a lie, large or small, white or any other color.

I ran a medical device company for a decade, and have run a number of other enterprises, which obviously, among other things, required me to hire and fire people. I believe that it can be truthfully said that every former employee that I fired would list me as a friend, as someone trustworthy and concerned with justice.

In sum I am familiar, to a degree, with the world and I hope my life provides some evidence of an ability to understand myself and other people, and to appreciate values and accomplishment.

I met Tim and Susanne when they contacted me via email in September of 2009, just a few weeks after they had first begun selling their lettuce to a local Costco. Tim proposed that we work together on a USDA grant that they had recently won, to see if, together, we could not advance the state of the art in biogas by developing a kind of off-the-shelf system suitable for small farms. (We have made considerable progress, and continue to work on this project, to this date.)

Following that first contact, we developed a deep friendship, which has been limited only, in my view, because we live so far from each other.

I find that Tim and Susanne exemplify a number of strong values. Susanne, for example, is honest, with herself and others, sometimes to a fault. But honesty, to my mind, is the prince of virtues, because where it becomes habitual, it provides a constant spur to improve oneself. She has a penetrating intellect and is a person of integrity. Tim is an enthusiastic and loving man, with a deceptively relaxed persona, who somehow accomplishes as much as several type-A dynamos working together. He accepts everyone as they are.

Together, they have done remarkable things, and gained accomplishments which promise to have very important positive impacts in the future. No doubt, for example, you have heard of their work

in aquaponics. They want to develop this art into something that can benefit the poor in villages around the world, and my hope is to assist them in so doing.

As I see it, their present difficult position has been brought about, as both would fervently affirm, and indeed have very frankly said to any number of their friends and acquaintances, by foolish and very ill-considered actions spurred by the stabbing worry of meeting the burden of an enormous mortgage. The fault is theirs, no question, and they understand that.

They have told me— and I believe them— that they did not understand the serious consequences which might well follow their actions, and given that we seem to be in a time of social change regarding the way our country will be dealing with marijuana— witness Colorado— that may perhaps be understandable.

Now, by the grace of God, I have not had the misfortune to be in their position. I do not use alcohol, mind-altering or illegal drugs of any description, as a matter of religious belief (I am a Bahá'í). And I have no professional experience with the law or with current philosophies of crime and punishment.

But I can say this: If the purpose of punishment is to cause a change in behavior, then Tim and Susanne have already made that change. If the purpose of imprisonment is to protect society, then surely the imprisonment of either would not benefit or protect society in the slightest; quite the opposite. If finally, the purpose of punishment is to exact a price for the crime, then Tim and Susanne have already paid a very considerable price in terms of their professional reputation, the expense of their legal situation, the very real possibility of losing their farm and business from behind bars, and most significantly the wrenching prospect of not being with their children during a number of critical years. Rose, for example, as you know, is 8.

In sum, I would urge you, your Honor, in the strongest terms, to offer them justice, which, (it seems to me) is in this case indistinguishable from leniency. Please allow them, your Honor, to continue to develop the good works on which they are embarked and to maintain the integrity of their family, and I feel certain that both of us will see marvelous fruits from them as a result of your wise decision, and their continuing and determined efforts.

Dear Judge Koybayashi:

I am writing on behalf of Tim and Susanne Friend and in support of supervised release.

I have known Tim and Susanne for three years now through their aquaponics business. I have contacted many aquaponics growers and consultants, and the Friends stand out like a beacon in their desire to share aquaponics and healthy, sustainable food with anyone in the world. I have yet to ever send them any money, but still they are always willing to answer all of my questions personally and patiently. They have sent lists of plants that grow well in systems, and countless tips on how to get started successfully. After one conversation Tim even sent plans that they sell for around \$1,000 to me for free. I did not request this, but Tim knew that I was struggling financially and simply sent them. He told me to get started if I could, and take care of my family. Nobody else in the industry that I've ever contacted has ever done anything except quote prices. Tim and Susanne are genuine, kind, giving, and humble.

I have worked now for 37 years serving families and youth in both professional and volunteer capacities. I've coached soccer teams, taught Sunday School, taught at the middle and high school levels, tutored music students, participated in booster programs and spent almost twenty years as a boy scout leader, and as an advocate and therapist for autistic youth. Both of my sons are Eagle Scouts, one of whom is among the most highly decorated Boy Scouts in history, and my other son a young man with autism who was not expected to do anything productive in his life.

In my many years working with families I have seen far too many parents make stupid decisions thinking they were protecting a family business and their children. Some of those decisions, as in the case of Tim and Susanne, were not just stupid but also illegal. One thing most of these decisions have in common is that they were made in

desperation and fear, hoping to protect families.

Tim and Susanne have shared with me some of the details of their mistake. They've admitted to me that they've done something really stupid and illegal, and are now realizing just how bad and far reaching the consequences can be. To be clear, I do not condone marijuana growth or use. That stated, I still support supervised release for Tim and Susanne.

Incarceration will only serve as punishment and will not serve to teach them not to break the law. I believe they've already learned that lesson, and it is reinforced every time they look at their children that are now at risk of losing their parents. Further, children cannot be simply stored away while their parents are in prison. Those children need parents and a home. Neither can the farm operate itself, or go dormant and survive. Incarceration will not only punish Tim and Susanne, but deeply harm their children, shut down their farm and end their livelihood. It will also close a productive local business supplying healthy, sustainable food to local families. It will also take their knowledge and skills out of reach of people like me. I am working to obtain funding for an aquaponics farm in Massachusetts and am counting on their guidance to start successfully.

By way of introduction, my name is Colleen H. Chong and I am a chartered accountant residing in Vancouver, Canada. I work as a senior tax associate at PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP, and serve as the treasurer of the Board of Directors at the Affiliation of Multicultural Societies and Services Agencies of British Columbia ("AMSSA").

I am writing you today with regards to the hearing of Susanne L. Friend ("Susanne") and Timothy Mann ("Tim"). I am asking for your leniency in sentencing them and plea that your sentence be merciful and not punitive – possibly community service or other alternative sentencing. Please consider the following:

I have known Susanne since I was very young. She has been a family friend of my parents since before I was born. My family lived in China and Japan before settling in Canada, and Susanne has visited and, in some instances, lived with us in these countries. Based on these extended periods of interactions with Susanne, I attest that she is an honest person. I have also paid visits to her Honoka'a home, and witnessed how the family and the aquaponics farm function. In my opinion, she is a good mother, and has so far raised hardworking and polite children.

I have known Tim since 2006 through Susanne. Tim has been welcoming and generous (with both tangible goods and time) each time I visited Honoka'a, and he was always sincere. During my visits I have also observed that he is an exceptionally diligent worker, building his home and farm, while providing for the whole family.

The crime committed was an error on their part; however, I believe this is an isolated occurrence and one caused by extraordinary circumstances. They are truly remorseful for the actions they have taken and accept all responsibilities. They have been forthcoming and candid with me and others about what has happened before and throughout this legal process, and admit their wrongdoing. I have personally observed that they disclose, voluntarily and in as much detail as requested, their legal situation to the participants of every aquaponics farm tour. They also communicate the situation fairly and openly with their children and employees.

I ask your Honor to please consider my letter when you hand down your decision.



I am writing to you today to offer my support for Tim Mann and Susanne Friend, who are to appear before you on or about February 13, 2014, and to encourage you to offer them an opportunity to atone for their crime under supervised release.

My name is Jim Frasché, and I operate a design/build company in Denver which focuses on urban agriculture here in Colorado, and on food security business development in Afghanistan, where I worked as a contractor from 2004 to 2007 developing opium poppy crop substitution programs through The International Foundation of Hope. We provided agricultural extension services to local farmers, and offered alternative livelihoods in fruit- and nut- tree orchard development. I have worked with farmers who have been drawn into the drug economy, and helped them back out of it by not only offering new opportunities in legitimate horticulture, but also by leveraging their new lives as role models for their farmer peers. The power of this combination of being a successful farmer growing legal crops, and publicizing that success, cannot be minimized in terms of the greater farmer community.

I met Tim and Susanne in March, 2011, when I attended a 4- day aquaponics training workshop which they conducted in Florida. Their idealism, passion, and deep appreciation for the food justice issues which drive me and my business approach were meaningful, but there was something else which stood out about them which is significant in our industry, particularly here in Colorado where marijuana has been decriminalized at the State level. Tim and Susanne were not just strident in their disclaimer of the appropriateness of aquaponics for growing marijuana, they were positively evangelical about it, and this message is pervasive in their current practice. I was not aware of the indictment against them at that time. These two people are leaders in an important and rapidly emerging technology and the application of that technology to do good- to educate, train and employ a new generation of farmers to grow and distribute locally produced, healthy and nutritious food in a sustainable and environmentally sound way. They are strong advocates against using these methods to cultivate drugs. It is an important anti- drug message to a constituency which can be susceptible to the temptation offered by "high value" crops.

Incarcerating Mr. Mann and Ms. Friend will have a severe impact on their minor children. Doing so would also result in a missed opportunity for them to continue to take a highly visible stand on this issue within the industry, based in operating a successful, consultancy based, food producing farm as an example for others. In my opinion, their continuing ability to promote this message from the platform of a successful, operating farm growing food for local markets is critical to the message.

Your Honor,

I write this letter in support of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend, requesting that you will be lenient in your judgment of their case before your bench, applying sentence that allows the family to remain physically together and for these two visionaries to continue their good work.

My understanding about the drug-related crimes for which they accepted responsibility is limited at best. Please be aware that I do not condone what I assume was a really stupid, though one-off transgression, one showing a desperate lack of sound judgment at the time.

As a Viet Nam veteran, a product of the sixties, I am unusual in that I can honestly declare that I have never used any illegal substances, even to this day. It stems from being issued pain medication in a remote location following a jeep accident and spending three days in a scary state of consciousness that I never wished to experience again, in any form. By contrast, I married a young woman when I got back, whose multi-racial family, many growing up in impoverished conditions, exposed me to drug use at every level. My brother-in-law, once a high school basketball star, chose the wrong path and died of a heroin overdose. Other relatives were in and out of prison for offenses ranging from drug possession to dealing in banned substances. I offer this background information because I have been personally touched by the ramifications of criminalizing drug use. I have helped to raise kids when parents have been incarcerated. I have witnessed the intergenerational damage done to our children and youth. As a member of Families and Friends of Prisoners in Boston during the seventies, I routinely drove the van to take loved ones from the city to visit their imprisoned family members at prisons located in far-away, rural communities.

Today, I applaud Attorney General Holder for questioning the effectiveness of the 'war on drugs' and beginning to refocus federal prosecution resources and question mandatory sentencing in certain drug-related cases. I am heartened to hear the Governor of Vermont call for much more emphasis on treatment rather than punishment for addressing the rampant use of more harmful, opiate drugs in his state. And then there is the growing sentiment among the electorate, with more states looking to decriminalize the use of marijuana and regulate (read, tax) its growth and distribution. I raise these aforementioned points to provide context and to more clearly articulate my own belief system.

In past lives, I have been an Associate Professor at a School for Human Services at New Hampshire College, now the University of Southern New Hampshire. For twelve years, I was the sole proprietor of the Institute for Community-Based Computers, a nonprofit business dedicated to bridging the 'digital divide,' before that term was coined. I returned to the academy as a Director of Computer Networking at a community college, later joining the corporate world where I am now employed as a Senior Principal Consultant with BT Americas (the former British Telecom).

For over five years, I have been exploring the subject of aquaponics, investing considerable time and financial savings in preparing a site and constructing facilities on our property in Southern Maine. My first wife passed in 1985 from a long bout with breast cancer and I have since remarried. My current wife is originally from Viet Nam. Our diet is primarily Vietnamese, which relies heavily on fresh green vegetables and herbs. We want to grow these year-round and be able to eventually sell these items to Asian markets and restaurants, as well as through farmers markets near where we live. Compare this with how, during the winter months, one local market gets their Thai basil air shipped a couple of times a week from Hawaii.

#### Dear Judge Kobayashi:

I am the president of a software company serving correctional agencies within the United States. My company provides case management solutions to probation agencies in Ohio and Washington, case management and fiscal management software for community-based correctional facilities in Ohio, and warehouse inventory systems for all prisons in the State of Ohio. Our client agencies support re-entry programs, drug courts, and various models of treatment within residential communities.

The mission of my company to provide tools to communities, similar to my own city of Portsmouth, Ohio, ravaged by the effects of drug abuse. This small community of fewer than 25,000 residents in south central Ohio has received national attention from the high incident of prescription drug abuse. However, all other forms of substance abuse, including meth-amphetamine, cocaine, and heroine are rampant, which creates all manner of trouble in our community.

I am also an elder of The Grace Community Church in Portsmouth, which is located just blocks from the Courthouse, and the homeless shelter. Daily, we receive multiple requests for food and "money for gasoline." We have become discerning in our benevolence ministry because we know the vast majority of these requests are meant to provide the means to acquire drugs. Furthermore, our jail ministry is a labor of love by men and women in our congregation who know the pain of their own children given over to addictions, and seek to rescue other young men and women while time permits.

I share this to underscore my understanding of the seriousness of the crime committed by Tim Mann and his wife Susanne Friend. In both my business and church experience, I see the impact of illegal drugs on individuals, families, and communities.

In early 2012, I began looking for possible projects to engage the men and women who were coming to the church doors. I wanted to find some type of enterprise where they could be productive and possibly learn skills leading to self-sufficiency. Urban agriculture and aquaponics caught my attention as prospects. Soon after starting my research, I discovered Friendly Aquaponics and I immediately discerned a very different ethic, compared to other practitioners and suppliers, embodied in postings on their website and beyond. I also discovered their conviction for cultivating marijuana. Conviction notwithstanding, I was convinced Friendly Aquaponics was the best source of reliable information and I began to communicate via email with both Tim and Susanne in preparation for coming from Ohio to Hawaii for three days of intensive, personalized training in June, 2012. I questioned them extensively on



the matter of their conviction and pending sentencing prior to sending payment for the course in advance. I came to the home and business of Tim and Susanne with my son-in-law and spent two of the planned three days touring their operation, learning how their system worked, and getting to know Tim and Susanne better. We covered much ground in two days, and decided to use the third day to tour two other aquaponics operations, which Tim and Susanne helped "birth" on the Island of Hawaii.

Since my visit to Hawaii, I have been evaluating the economics and relative merits of various aquaponics systems as they translate to my local markets and climate. I have studied multiple systems, but Friendly Aquaponics continues to rank as the most viable system and the most trustworthy, consistent source of information to this day. For their voices to be silenced by incarceration would be a tragedy for their family, but also a great loss to the community of aquaponics enthusiasts and practitioners worldwide.

I have seen many attempts by courts and churches to restore fallen men and women after life in prison. Sadly, very few ever truly regain the lives they once knew and often the cost to society continues for years because of the economic toll. Tim and Susanne have acknowledged their wrongdoing and, more importantly, they have demonstrated by their work and lives the quality of true repentance (i.e. change in direction) for their actions. Moreover, they have become valued contributors to communities and economies within Hawaii, across the United States, and around the world.

I ask that you consider these facts in the determination of sentencing of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend.

Out of a desire to start my own business selling fresh produce, I began researching aquaponics in the summer of 2010. This research quickly led me to Friendly Aquaponics and Susanne Friend and Tim Mann. Just as quickly, I found out about their arrest for growing marijuana, which was unfortunate for many reasons, including a personal one – I very much wanted to attend one of their trainings but was concerned about their decisions, integrity and whether they would be around to support me.

In November 2010, and as a potential but uncommitted student, I sent an email to Susanne asking her about what she had done and how that decision might impact me as a potential customer/student long after the training was completed. Would they be around to support me and continue to provide resources for a future commercial aquaponics farmer?

Not only did I receive a very timely response back, I was truly amazed at the candor of Susanne's words. She did not attempt to deny, hide or excuse her decisions. Rather, she openly acknowledged the stupidity that jeopardized her family and business. I was so impressed with her response that I immediately signed up for the March 2011 training conducted in Florida, committing thousands of dollars for travel and tuition costs.

During that training session, I was not disappointed at all, with the material or with the character of both Susanne and Tim. They openly discussed the foolish decision they had made and took full responsibility for it in front of dozens of students and colleagues, even imploring us not to make the same mistakes. This was heartfelt and emotional and I give them lots of credit for standing up and discussing this so openly in front of so many strangers. My only regret was that I did not wait and save up more money to attend a training at their farm in Hawaii, to see it and walk it for myself.

In October 2012, that opportunity presented itself and I was able to invest several more thousands of dollars to travel to Hawaii so I could participate in another week of training at the Friendly farm, I learned more about commercial aquaponics using deep water culture technology and I also learned more about Tim and Susanne. They truly believe what they teach (aquaponics and beyond) and share a sincere desire to see the world become a better place for many people in need.

In April 2013, I resigned from my professional management position and began building a commercial aquaponics system. In less than one year, I have sold produce at two farmer's markets and two local restaurants, I sell produce through a retail display a a local coffee shop and this past week made the front page of the oldest weekly newspaper in WV, *Spirit of Jefferson*. There is also an article about Tangy Produce in a regional magazine called *Around the Panhandle*. I have a National Geographic reporter coming out this Saturday to look at my operation.

Your Honor,

My name is Ginger Christie, and I write this letter as testament to the characters of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend. First, let me state that I do not know nor am I related in any way to said Roger Christie. Never heard of him before this.

I live in western North Carolina and am currently self-employed in the financial field. Prior to North Carolina, I lived and worked in Manhattan, New York City, most recently for Tekserve, a company that has grown into the largest single-location Apple reseller in the country, offering both sales and service. As a senior member of the staff, among my responsibilities were staff training, including creating the training program and work procedures, advertising, creating inhouse educational programs for our customers along with public outreach, and consulting (both sales and service) for a select group of clients. It was my privilege to work for and with some of the most brilliant people I've ever met. I include some of my customers in that group as well.

Currently, I am involved in my NC community, working with both the local food co-op and a group I helped found to teach, share knowledge and foster healthy, sustainable living in our community in every way - building practices and materials, energy creation and conservation, healthy air, water and food. Together we're creating an incredible network of people and skills, a very viable community in the truest sense of the word. I'm also a home gardener, and I'm currently taking a course in bee keeping.

This part of the country is real farming country, generations of farmers, where many products are grown, but the most important food crops are apples and tomatoes, along with sweet corn, salad greens and onions. My county produces 85% of the apples grown in North Carolina. Being such an important crop, the farmers spray their orchards with pesticides in the spring. You don't want to be anywhere near there then, because truly, you cannot breathe. As folks are becoming aware of and concerned about pesticides and fertilizer chemicals in their food and water, about genetically modified produce, they are demanding better quality and wanting more control over what goes into their bodies.

While some can supply organic produce, there are many growers in a bind because the decades of using chemical fertilizers and pesticides have so embedded those substances in the soil that they would need to remove 6-9" of the top soil to get rid of the poisons, a very costly undertaking which most cannot afford. Many of these farmers weren't even fully aware of what they were putting on their fields and crops. Many are shocked to now learn the full ramifications and legacy of their usage. There is a town close to me where the well water has become so contaminated with farm chemicals and pesticides that they have to truck potable water in. This is serious stuff. And it's not just here. So this is where Friendly Aquaponics' systems shine, offering a way to cut out the poisons and pollution using 1/10 of the water, with a much smaller area required to grow high-density, high-nutrition food. No fertilizer, no pesticides. Real food.



aquaponics system for their needs up and running for their organization. Others were attending on full or partial scholarship. Like I said, amazing. Yes, Susanne and Tim are working to make a living with Friendly Aquaponics, but that isn't their focus. Their goal is to empower people to live better, healthier lives, and I do believe they're succeeding.

Tim and Susanne created such an atmosphere of sharing and cooperation, where all were welcome to contribute their knowledge, skills and experience. The discussions were far-ranging and varied. Some of those discussions led to refinements right on the spot. And it wasn't all nuts and bolts, but also about building and running a business. Both Susanne and Tim stressed over and over how important it is to start small so that your overhead doesn't sink you or drive you into making terrible choices, perhaps with serious consequences. It was fascinating, it was stimulating, it was challenging, it was exciting.

Of course, the question of growing marijuana in an aquaponics system came up. They both said unequivocally that it did NOT work with their system at all. What followed then was truly remarkable. Susanne stood in front of all of us and with tears flowing, proceeded to tell us \*everything\* about how they came to know that fact about pot and their system and what a huge mistake they had made. She left nothing out - how they got in way over their heads financially, how they entered into a dubious arrangement with Mr. Christie, aware that there was some murkiness in the legality of it but clearly with a very imperfect understanding of the consequences of that action. How that decision and association resulted in both of them being arrested. How they might not get to watch their kids grow up. How they had let fear cloud their judgement and betray their own values, how shamed they felt to have brought this upon their family and friends, especially their children, not the role models they had hoped to be. She implored us to not be stupid like they had been (yes, she said that), to not get lost, not forget who you are and what you believe in. They made a really stupid mistake, which they regret.

I hadn't known a thing about the arrests prior to Susanne's disclosure. It would have been so easy for them to not mention it at all. Instead, they used it as a profound teaching opportunity on so many levels - technical, legal, and most importantly, moral. I cannot tell you how impressed I was - by their honesty, their integrity, their sincere remorse and their courage in taking very public responsibility for their choices and actions in front of their students.

I spent only one week in the physical presence of Susanne and Tim. I wrote one letter because I know them as a team. I would welcome spending more time with them and getting to know them better, as they are two of the finest people I've ever met. I believe in their mission. I have so much respect for them. I am honored to know them. I'd be in that courtroom in person if I could. I believe they're doing incredibly important work, and I hope I've managed to convey how much good they are doing, how much good they've already done. It's just so important that they be able to continue. Please. The world needs more Tims and Susannes.

Please forgive the exposition, but I wanted to underscore how incredibly important the work and teachings of Friendly Aquaponics are, what led me to Tim and Susanne's newsletter and classes in the first place. I learned of Friendly Aquaponics In February, 2012, and signed up for the free newsletter. I had read about aquaponics prior to that, but the Friendly Aquaponics newsletter conveyed its information in such a clear, concise and easy-to-understand manner, no small feat for a complex topic. I was astounded at the amount - and depth - of information freely given in these newsletters. They literally taught how to put together an efficient - and affordable - aquaponics system through the newsletters. For free! Unheard of. Information for which others would charge hundreds, or even in some cases, thousands of dollars, Tim and Susanne were sharing for free. It was clear that they were passionate about helping people to live healthier lives and giving them the tools to do so. Everything that one needed to know to get started with a viable small aquaponics system was freely offered, they gave free tours at their farm, and further instruction and kits were offered at reasonable cost. Yes, it was their business, but most important was getting the knowledge out there to as many as possible so that all could feed themselves and others healthy nourishing food.

I jumped at the opportunity to study with them in person when they offered their first teaching in Tennessee, taking the week-long intensive of all their courses in September, 2012 - one incredible week. This series drew people from all over the country. There were about 40 of us. My classmates were an amazing cross-section of people - passionate, intelligent, concerned. Many of us were there to learn not just for ourselves, but to take it back to our families and communities, to our organizations, to other countries even - share what we learned.

Tim and Susanne were/are amazing teachers. Incredibly intelligent - brilliant even, fiercely passionate about their work and about food quality and safety, about the world we live in and how we're treating it. Their material was clear, thorough and detailed. Both were open to any and all questions, sharing literally everything that they had learned themselves thus far, including the mistakes they made along the way. Our class tuition included any and all future refinements and information with support forever. Wow. Some of their solutions and procedures were just \*so\* smart. Simply elegant in their design and execution, improving and streamlining without cutting any corners or lowering any standards - and no extravagant costs. Truly, truly impressive work. I've seen some of their competitors' offerings. They don't come anywhere near to the quality, high standards and superior designs of Friendly Aquaponics, and they cost quite a bit more, to boot - both to build and to operate. Just no comparison.

When Tim found out that there were a few people in the group who wouldn't be attending the final course, on commercial aquaponics, he immediately waived their fee, saying that they had to stay, that it was too important, that they needed to learn this information and take it back. I remember that one of those people gifted was a woman who had been sent by her group, an inner-city organization that dealt with kids. They couldn't afford to send her to all the classes, and that final course was \*exactly\* the information they needed to get the appropriate



Exceptional Foods From Your Neighborhood Farm

Dear Honorable Judge Leslie Koybayashi,

I am writing this letter for your consideration regarding the case of Susanne Friend and Tim Mann.

They contacted me about a year ago to learn more about my growing operations, including my greenhouse aquaponics system.

My family has been doing business for about ten years as RainFresh Harvests and we have a small farm in Ohio on nine acres of land. We operate two small greenhouses and harvest herbs, salad greens, berries and orchard fruit for sale to a number of different local wholesale markets, caterers and restaurants including both of the local Whole Foods locations in Columbus, Ohio.

I do not know Susanne and Tim personally, but only in a professional capacity. They were interested in coordinating training meetings at our farm, but I felt that I did not have a large enough facility nor was my system capable of being modified to utilize their design. Therefore I have no business dealings with them, nor do I have any financial benefits for writing this letter in their support.

However, I have maintained contact and appreciate their online Friendly Aquaponics Newsletter where they share their knowledge and experiences without charge to other interested aquaponic growers. They also offer professional training for a fee at a variety of locations and have recently published a book about aquaponics that I have not yet purchased, but it appears to be a very complete source of information for beginning growers.

I cannot personally attest to their redeeming personal traits, but from what I have read in their newsletters and learned about from their experiences, they have a lot of important information and skills to share with others. They are focused on providing others with tools to accomplish their goals for creating regional, family oriented greenhouse operations that can potentially allow for economically sustainable businesses that provide the freshest, healthiest possible produce to meet with local demand.

I also do not know the details of their legal problems other than that they have been charged with some very serious federal crimes, nor do I profess to be aware of the penalties or laws relating to their activities. I have not grown, nor do I condone the growing or sale of illegal crops. There are states that are currently allowing recreational use of this plant, but this obviously was not legal in your state at the time of their being charged and that your responsibility is to rule on the law as it was at that time and not to consider what it might be in the coming years, even as societal norms continue to change.

They have shared some of the details about how they turned their lives around to pursue a more law abiding way of life. They also have demonstrated the potential to continue to make important contributions to the developing field of aquaponics.

Their dedication to the mission of providing people with a way to grow fresh, healthy food while minimizing any negative impact on the environment is worthy of your consideration. I have been able to utilize some of the information that they have shared with the general public to improve my operations and gain a better understanding of the interaction of the systems involved with growing fish and plant crops together.

They have also learned some lessons about taking out too large of a loan and not being able to meet the payments and have advised enthusiastic entrepreneurs that would sink their retirement funds or make large loans that it is best to start small and gradually build up their business. This is similar to what I have learned over the years, as I also invested a little more to start my business up than I should have, based on the profit margins and returns on investment that I have realized, but was fortunate enough to have other income and a source health benefits to support our family over the years and have not been faced with dilemma how to make the loan payments.

From a note that they sent me, it sounds like Susanne and Tim tried their best to manage their loan load and made some bad decisions along the way when they chose to grow the wrong crop to generate income to pay off their loan and provide for their family. It also sounds like they have learned from their mistakes and that what they are doing now is moving forward in a more responsible and favorable direction.

As a judge, you have the challenge of weighing all the positives and negatives to determine the right punishment for the crime and to make sure that justice and ultimately the greater good of society is being served.

Thank you for taking time to read this letter and I hope that you will take into consideration the actions of both Susanne and Tim in recent years to make amends and move forward in a responsible manner.


I have casually known Tim Mann and Susanne Friend since about 2000, when my wife and I were visiting Hawaii, and contemplating retirement on the Hamakua Coast. At that time Tim and Susanne owned and operated the Macnut factory in Honokaa as artist studio space, and Tim also had his own architectural drafting service. My wife was a high school art teacher and professional artist, and was considering renting space in the facility. Tim and Susanne seemed very ambitious and capable business owners, and gave us a great sense of encouragement in deciding to relocate to the area.

It was not until just after the October 2006 earthquake that I happened to see Tim again. At that time I was attending a community meeting in Paauilo, where we now lived, and Tim was offering his services and equipment to help any residents in the area who needed assistance removing trees and debris from their property or access roads, for free. That offer stuck with me, since it was the kind of spirit and sense of community that we were looking for, and appreciative of, in our move to rural Hawaii from Massachusetts in 2004.

It wasn't until several years later that I again crossed paths with Tim and Susanne. This time I became interested in the aquaponics systems that they were developing. I attended their farm tour several times, and was very impressed with this new (to me) method of food production. I strongly believed in the importance and development of locally sourced food products, and the natural integration of fish and vegetable production through the aquaponic system of theirs seemed a perfect fit for our climate and environment.

In 2009 I attended one of their first courses in aquaponic farming at NHERC. I was surprised by the professional level of the course, and materials that they had prepared for their students. The course was inspirational and motivating, and it was obvious that the other students (from all over the country and outside the country) were anxious to begin their own ventures in aquaponic farming according to the methods that Tim and Susanne had developed, and continued to perfect. Both Tim and Susanne were great mentors, sharing all that they knew, and encouraging others to be able to take on a new endeavor with confidence and the knowledge that they would always be there to help with any problems that might arise.

It was obvious from the manner in which Tim and Susanne operated that they were genuinely concerned with the success of their students and spreading their enthusiasm for



the project. Their dedication seemed more of a "calling" than just a business, even though they also conducted themselves at a very professional level, obtaining highly coveted "organic" certification and acceptance for their produce by Costco. They involved every member of their growing family in the project, and welcomed all visitors and students into their family to share in the experience.

I was very surprised when I heard that Tim and Susanne had become involved in the legal problems that are presently weighing upon them. It really seems out of character, and contrary to their nature to put in jeopardy all that they have worked for and built for their family's future. But, I am still unaware of the specifics in this case, so I can not condone or condemn their specific actions.

It appears that lessons have been learned though, and nothing more might be gained by limiting or removing otherwise productive and intelligent individuals from their mentoring and family lives. I believe that the greater good might come from their redemption, and ability to continue on with the work that they are committed to, and nurturing of their family and community.

I am presently working with the Chinese University of Hong Kong to grow Chinese herbal medicine organically.

My association with Susanne and Tim was a most pleasant one. After my first introduction to aquaponics, I returned for a second year to learn solar greenhouse design. Both Susanne and Tim are very frank and honest people. They have nothing to hide not only in their own trade secrets but also in acknowledging the mistakes they have made. I have come across another aquaponics workshop on US Mainland where I was asked to sign an agreement not to infringe on their intellectual rights before taking up their training course.

I have been working together with a non-profit reputable organization, The Kadoorie Farm & Botanic Garden with a 50 years of history, and we have jointly conducted four successful training courses in the past years. Several schools have already set up their own systems in their school yards. They found it an excellent teaching tool for children. I am seriously considering to invite Susanne and Tim to conduct the courses in future.

One of my friends, Shumin Wang from Shangdon Province, who attended the Hawaiian workshop in the same year as I did has already established the largest aquaponics farm in China. Previously I tried to get Susanne and Tim to visit my own farm in Wuyishan, China but without success due to their travel restriction. I truly believe that they will contribute greatly to the welfare of my country. I look forward to their visit one day.

Dear Judge Kobayashi,

I am writing this letter in support of Susanne Friend and Tim Mann, and in order to help preventing further harm to the whole family. I know Susanne and Tim, and their children, since I moved to Honoka'a, Hawaii, from Germany in early 2008.

My name is Alexander Czerny, I am the business owner of Alex Piano Unlimited, LLC. I work as a piano tuner/technician, serving the whole Big Island of Hawaii. Furthermore I am a piano teacher at Hawaiian Preparatory Academy and Parker School in Kamuela. I also give private piano lessons in people's homes. Besides that I perform as a pianist on stage, for example with Grammy award winner Gary Washburn, or with international artists.

From 2010 to July 2013 I gave weekly piano instructions for Susanne's and Tim's exceptionally intelligent children Jack, Luck and Rose at their home near Honoka'a. (In 2013 I moved to North Kohala, about 50 miles away, which unfortunately interrupted frequent lessons. Currently I'm preparing a better teaching schedule that makes frequent trips to Honoka'a possible so that we can resume piano lessons.)

In January and February, 2012, I have voluntarily translated their FriendlyAquaponics construction manual into German language; German is my first language. During this time I learned a lot about the importance of Aquaponics for future food supply especially in dry climates or places with poor soil. Tim and Susanne are pioneers in research. I can confirm that Friendly Aquaponics Inc. is known here and in Europe to have built the first commercially viable Aquaponics system in the world. They also were the first ones that had a deal with Costco, for example. Tim and Susanne invested a lot of time and money in improving their system, and to find out which plants are able to grow in Aquaponics throughs, and which not.

Now, I'm getting straight to the point: Everybody here knows that Tim and Susanne got busted while experimenting with growing small Marihuana plants in Aquaponics troughs. Since years they talk very openly, to everyone, about their, as they call it, "stupid idea". Already two or even three years ago Tim and Susanne told me that they may go to prison for that. Honestly, I didn't give much about this. I wasn't much aware of differences between the laws in Germany and the U.S., so I could not believe that they actually may end up in prison for trying to grow Cannabis in Aquaponics troughs. (Since 15 years or so, growing pot in Germany usually ends up, as far as I know, with acquittance or with a rather small fine. Little did I know about Federal laws in the U.S., which I certainly respect.)

I personally, as a teacher, don't use and don't approve the use of mind altering drugs. Neither do Tim and Susanne. In more than five years I haven't seen them drinking even a glass of wine or so. Using any drugs, legal or illegal, just makes one less intelligent and doesn't go together with learning an musical instrument anyway.

As I said, the whole story with Tim and Susanne didn't seem a big deal to me – until now. I still can't believe that they may have to go to prison. This would be a big harm not only to the future of Aquaponics, but also to the whole family, and especially their kids, my students Jack, Luck and Rose. They are a wonderful family; everybody in Honoka'a will confirm that. Tim and Susanne know that they have to pay for their "stupid idea"; they certainly accept their responsibility. But you can't believe how afraid especially the kids are with the prospect of seeing Tim and Susanne in prison.

I beg you to consider that.

I am writing on behalf of Tim Mann & Susanne Friend, my name is Randy Campbell, I live in a small town in Tennessee and I operate an aquaponic farm.

I am aware of the legal issues that Tim and Suzanne face and I have been aware for many years; in fact I could say that their arrest had a large influence on me getting to know them better. Tim & Suzanne publically shared the story of their crime at a training event they were teaching and I was attending. I immediately recognized the seriousness of their crime and feared incarceration would end the incredibly beneficial work they were doing with aquaponics. Their public confession of their mistakes inspired me to learn more. I had been following their aquaponic work for several years and shared their passion for its importance.

I approached Tim and Susanne with the idea to offer the aquaponic training that they had developed, here on my farm. I did get to know their family and character and proudly say that we became family.

I don't pretend to fully understand all of the intents of modern incarceration; perhaps it is to protect society, to create a deterrent for other offenders or to seek restitution to the community.



I humbly suggest the Tim Mann and Susanne Friend have aggressively provided "restitution "to the community and I believe they will continue. Their passion, sincerity, efforts and commitment to provide the "world community" with knowledge and skill to grow food is a payment to society that cannot fully be measured as it perpetually creates dividends. Their community service has impacted thousands and has directly led to hungry people being fed both here and abroad. Their efforts have helped countless numbers achieve food independence and access to higher quality food. Their efforts are having a ripple effect that continues to grow and make our food supply less fragile and certainly healthier. I know that the character of these two individuals, will not allow them to discontinue their service to the world community if given the opportunity.





My job is with children and giving them opportunities to succeed. Tim Mann and Susanne Friend's level of expertise can help a lot more people than just ours. The only ones that stand to lose their opportunity are their children.





After several attempts at writing individual letters in support of Tim and Susanne, I have come to the conclusion that it's impossible to talk about the one without including the other. They are a team – Tim always says that Susanne has the brains and the beauty while he is the one who implements their ideas – and are both passionate about their family and their work. There is just no separating them, either from each other or from these two passions. Over the years I have come to know and greatly respect both Tim and Susanne.

Because their aquaponic systems actually work, and very well at that, Tim and Susanne could have patented and become wealthy but, as I have come to recognize over time, that is just not who they are. Tim is one of the most unassuming people I have ever met and I really doubt that he would do anything with the sole intention of making money. Sure, I know he was very proud of a fine, relatively expensive pair of cowboy boots he owns but I think that was largely due to the fact that he got them at a bargain price (I seem to remember he found them at a thrift store but it may have been on eBay) and the cool sound the heels made on the floor. He has owned some beautiful boats but only because he lovingly crafted each one of them; he wasn't motivated to own an expensive asset but to make something wonderful, usually by denying himself all sorts of other things in order to be able to afford the materials. For most of his life Tim has deliberately chosen to live simply, close to nature. So, I can categorically state, if Tim decided to grow pot it was never because he wanted power or wealth but only because he was trying to save everything he cares about.



If I were privileged to sit on a jury as a peer of Susanne and Tim, I would recall the times that I have been between a rock and a hard place and some of the regrettable decisions I have made under pressure. The reason I can live with myself after some of those decisions is that I made the wrong decision but for the right reasons. Susanne and Tim are good, hardworking family people. Misguided they may have been but there is no doubt in my mind that their motive was purely to save their family and their farm.

I truly believe that Susanne and Tim have already served a sentence of many years with this hanging over them, punished by uncertainty and the dread of losing everything they hold dear. They are not and never will be hardened criminals; they are parents of young children and caretakers of elderly parents who depend on them. I cannot envision any way that society would be best served by incarcerating either of them or by punishing them further. Not only will their loved ones suffer – I think, especially, of their children – but who will care for their family, especially if they are not there to tend their farm and lose their means of support. Their family will go from self-supporting to dependency. (Something I know that Susanne would absolutely abhor as it goes against all her deeply held principles and their goals of creating self-sufficiency for all.)

If Susanne and Tim lose their farm their research into scalable aquaponics systems will cease. Years ago I became interested in aquaponics in order to grow pesticide-free food for family and friends. Fortuitously, I came across Tim and Susanne's website back when they were first getting started. What immediately impressed me was that they were passionate about what they were doing, backing it up with science (grounded in Susanne's biology background) and real-time experience. Most astonishing to me, they were willing to freely share their knowledge. (I later learnt that this is because of their deep personal conviction that no-one should go hungry and they want to develop and share knowledge of aquaponics as it offers the potential of revolutionizing sustainable food production.) At that time I was calling and writing for information from all the aquaponics developers that I came across but, without fail, developers wanted a large, upfront investment and the purchase of a full system. Which is all well and good but all were very cagey about actual results and system specifics. Most systems are patented and very technology intensive and not scalable. But, as Susanne and Tims' hard won experience shows, starting out small is critically important, particularly if you have to take out a loan to build a system. If you have a loan, it's a race to profitability, from the day you sign the loan papers to the day the loan money runs out. If time runs out, and you cannot make the loan payments, you will be under the kind of pressure they were.

In stark contrast to all other companies I have come across, from the start Tim and Susanne have been motivated to share their discoveries in order to maximize the potential of aquaponics to feed people across the world. What I have since found is that knowledge shared is knowledge multiplied and everyone benefits. From the beginning I noticed on their website that they regularly gave farm tours where the public could walk through their property and Tim actually describes to them (with great delight) how everything works. Let me be honest, this is probably not something I would have been generous enough to do. (I.e., openly share my hard won knowledge plus have people tramping through all my stuff.)

My background is in accounting and IT which led me to pursue a Master's degree in Information Systems after my two children and I immigrated to America when I was in my forties. In April, 2002, I was able to leverage my degree and years of experience in the business world to become the Branch Administrator for the San Diego Branch of Ludwig Cancer Research, supporting an international community of distinguished scientists dedicated to preventing and controlling cancer. Our scientists, clinicians, and support staff in countries around the world focus on multiple aspects of basic and clinical cancer research, including cancer genetics and genomics, tumor immunology, and cell growth and differentiation, pursuing breakthroughs to alter the course of cancer. The Ludwig Institute conducts its own research and clinical trials, making it a bridge from the most basic questions of life to the most pressing needs of cancer care. Since its inception, the Institute has invested more than \$1.5 billion of its own resources in cancer research, and has an endowment valued at \$1.2 billion.

I expect to retire from Ludwig one of these days, slow down a little and be able to devote myself to spending more time with family, focusing on my four beloved grandchildren, sharing my values of honesty, simplicity and self-reliance, teaching them to farm, and sharing our love of animals and nature. Who could ask for more!

I would like to introduce myself to you. I am a Canadian citizen and connected with Tim Mann and Suzanne Friend, four years ago pursuing an interest to develop international educational partnerships in aquaponics and sustainable organic food production. I have strong interests in sustainable organic food production, leading others to dig up grassroots' organic food growing initiatives, getting back to basics and preserving our own local food for optimal health benefits.

I am Registered Nurse having worked in Canada and have training in both traditional medicine and alternative medicine. I have worked in medicines frontline practicing both western and eastern medicine for the past twenty two years. I have been a distributor of a variety of natural health and wellness products, including the largest herbal/vitamin company in Canada, emotional tree essences, holistic remedies and iridology. I have strong interests and strive for local or Canadian organic food movements especially within our youth, aquaponics, agricultural, and recently light emitting diode (LED) light therapy. For twenty three years I have been a board member, assistant chair and secretary for Celebrate Canada Celebrations every July 1. For fifteen years I have been an active parent on two parent school councils and for the last three years a parent representative on the Niagara District School Board. I have over 20 years experience in a family owned heavy construction business, participating in all aspects of

the business, hobby animal farm and gardening. I am living passionately and motivated with the ability to share knowledge and intuitive skills enhancing the wellbeing, empowerment and spiritual wellbeing with all humankind. I am happily married with two beautiful children and very family orientated.

You see Friday, January 13, 2006; eight years ago I was working as a Registered Nurse in labour and delivery. An injury occurred at work this day that prompted me to look at a different aspect in life. Five years ago it was recommended I further my education. I enrolled in an advanced self expression, transformational leadership program. I had to create a community project in something that I was passionate about and to have this project be sustainable once complete. The ability to alter the environment to which you truly express yourself in that your family and community welcome and further your contributions is a huge breakthrough. I had no idea what or how I was going to create this community project. I have always been a huge advocate for organic, home grown healthy food, preserving, live juicing, herbs, herbs for medicine, spices, using food and anything from nature as your medicine.

In the spring of 2009 Bill 8, Healthy Food for Healthy Schools in Ontario Canada became a new policy. For the community project in this leadership course I wanted to convert the defunct greenhouse at the high school and make it operational and alive with food production. There was no funding provincially, no Funding federally and no school board funding available and a dilapidated building with some lighting, running water and a heating system that needed to be cleaned up. Fifteen years previous to this there was a horticulture program at the school for special needs and the program was cut by the ministry of education. Since then the light has been in pilot mode flickering. This kind of reminds of the song from Girl Guides Canada in the Brownie division "Brownies" called "This Little Light of Mine".

As a young person I was always fascinated with greenhouses, cold frame gardening, hydroponics and being able to purchase food locally in the winter sub zero conditions or off season. The idea of chemically feeding organic produce for your table has always sat a little uncomfortable with me. I can remember my grandmother asking if you're driving out near the Muliboom hydroponic farm could you make the detour and stop in for me. She loved there tomatoes and cucumbers.

As an active parent on the school committee I was googling ideas on how to transform this greenhouse organically. Though Google and the internet I found Friendly Aquaponics and Tim Mann and Suzanne Friend. Without Tim and Suzanne's support and dedication to sustainable aquapones food production and their dedication to enabling others to do the same is

extremely empowering contribution to the environment. In assisting the organic food chain possibilities in others lives and in making sustainable food possibilities happen globally is commendable.

I had this ingenious brainstorm to transform the existing partially used greenhouse to aquaponics. I wrote to Tim and Suzanne they wrote back and offered their training manual for a fee that I was unable to purchase financially. I introduced the idea and a community fund competition idea to the school principle. I received the principles permission. We entered the Aviva Community Fund Competition under the title Project Green Falcon http://www.avivacommunityfund.org/ideas/2011/acf11172.

We created alot of community involvement and was blessed with media coverage, a connection with another secondary school in Ontario that has aquaponics. The project brought alot of conversation and public awareness of safe food sustainability and possibilities. Community gardening is slowly blossoming here. We found another Aquaponics farm in Buffalo NY and are networking with them. Unfortunately we did not obtain funding. During the entire four month competition we raised awareness in the community and we shared the assistance of Tim and Suzanne and the possibility of international networking and partnerships. We were eager to find someone in Ontario with the same interests and at the time this innovative idea occurred to me people kept telling me I was running an uphill battle and this would never materialize. Too expensive, too many regulations, and comments similar to "and you think you are going to live off the land" and laugh and stating that we would need millions of dollars in financial and in-kind support. For these reasons many people expressed this innovative idea would cost more than what anyone ever would profit financially, essentially not feasible. It occurred these people making statements probably have never taken the opportunity to see where there food really comes from. As long as food is on the table who really cares?

With the assistance of Tim and Suzanne we had the ability to develop our aquaponics system and to alter the environment in our family greenhouse. Tim and Suzanne are an enormous contribution to the environment. Tim and Suzanne have provided us with the best information possible and showed us how to build our very own aquaponics system and better yet how to grow healthy organic food for our tables. Tim and Suzanne's DIY manual is worth its weight in gold, which has been an immeasurable gift.

Tim and Susanne's support to us and to the school programs has been overwhelmingly fantastic. They both have offered beyond more than any measurable guidance all in a timely manner. We have spent a lot of money to build our aquaponics farm and have not yet

generated any income. The dedication to emails and farm updates are a valuable share of information and continue to inspire us and keep our interest pursuing and sharing aquaponics. Their passion to share genuine knowledge and talents is exemplar and these we all truly grateful.

The demographical region we live in is one of Canada's largest cancerous populations. Many people have concerns with food industry and presently there are increasing concern levels within our youth. An enormous part of our food growing and industry has migrated overseas to Asia, Mexico, and Europe or to the USA. When I was a child just to name a few industries in this region were Delmonte Canada, Aylmer, E.D. Smith, Green Giant, Bick's and Heinz they were Canada Grade A Fancy. None of these companies exist today in Canada. The rich land from these growers has been developed.

Presently we are volunteering at two schools in Ontario and are working on partnerships with Two School Boards, Food Banks Canada, Ministry of Education, Canadian Wild Life Federation, Vineland Research Center, Niagara College and Guelph University. I have had the opportunity to participate and have had family support in transformative learning courses and seminars. If the injury didn't happen eight years ago, would any of these possibilities transpired? Tim and Suzanne are excellent examples in teaching and in leadership commitments.

Tim and Suzanne are two ordinary people honestly focusing their minds and hearts to teach families, individuals, and communities to grow organic, healthy vegetables, so that they teach others how to live vibrant, independent and free lives. It is easy to go off your shining path and get swallowed into the mission of another and this is what clearly occurs to have happened to Tim and Suzanne. Tim and Suzanne have promised and stated in writing to us that this is clearly a naive and unintelligent mistake and now realize the seriousness of their actions and will never let this happen ever again. This is something they both genuinely whole heartily regret. This is clearly an example of human actions lacking or being out of integrity and the lessons in life one can learn at an enormous sacrifice. However, I still do not approve of what they did and they are guilty of and responsible for their own actions. Tim and Suzanne cognizance and understanding is clearly evident that they were wrong in their actions. We have all made mistakes and wrongful decision in thinking we are doing good for others. Instead of minding our own business and going about our own ways we become quilted or swayed into aiding other people's missions. I believe Tim and Suzanne are vibrant good parents, family and community orientated individuals that are simply striving to do well, teaching their children and community member's good morals and values of all things.

Tim and Suzanne's ability to welcome others and their contributions globally contributes to successful global organic food sustainability. This opportunity is exemplar! The ability to empower individuals locally and globally to discovering what it takes to develop or to alter the environment in which you express yourself, so that your environment welcomes and furthers your contribution is by far truly exemplar. Tim and Suzanne are crucial to the success of programs in that organic food sustainability is clearly the paramount in education, feeding the mind as hungry minds cannot learn. I entrust that you find yourself lenient and discover what it takes to further contributions and to envelope the ability to enhance organic food sustainability, encompassing experiential education.

Your Honor, I hope that Tim Mann and Susanne Friend are given supervised release for their abysmally stupid decision of trying to grow marijuana on their property several years ago.



Shortly thereafter, I dropped out of the drug culture and continued to pursue my studies. Later that year I started meeting with a local church and after a couple of years began serving as the church's property and maintenance manager. After 32 years I am still serving the same church in the same capacity.

In my experience, simply touching authority was adequate to set me back on a proper path. Similarly, I feel that Tim Mann and Susanne Friend have touched Federal authority and that that touch alone has set them back on a proper path. I sincerely hope you feel the same way.

Judge Kobayashi,

Greetings and salutations from Southern USA! Thank you for taking time to read my letter. I find myself in uncharted waters, as this is the first time I've used this letterhead in an unofficial capacity. To be clear, I voluntarily brought my career to a close after 15 and ½ years with the Georgia Department of Corrections as a Public Safety Training Instructor in December of 2012. I tell you this so we are clear that I am no longer representing that agency but also to ensure you that I left in good standing and on my own terms. I thoroughly enjoyed both my work and those I partnered with throughout my years in law enforcement but that chapter in my life is now closed.

You see, Judge Kobayashi, what causes me to write to you all the way out there in the middle of the Pacific ocean from my home here in central Georgia is a couple of people whom I have never laid eyes on, nor had the courtesy of speaking to on the phone or even exchanging text messages with in real time. I know of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend only through their training manual that I purchased, quite literally, within a week and a half of setting my 15+ year career in law enforcement and training aside. It would be fair to say that Tim and Susanne are completely unaware of my existence, as well, outside of an order confirmation email from their corporation *Friendly Aquaponics* and their subsequent email newsletters that are delivered to my Gmail account automatically.

This all may sound very bizarre but please, bear with me. I am a man of great faith. My father was a Clinical Chaplain with the Georgia Department of Corrections and retired after close to 25 years of service. I like to think that I was able to view and understand the law from both its point of origination (God/my own father's teachings and career) and its point of application (my career) during that time. To be sure, Judge Kobayashi,



the world is no fan of accountability with regard to the law. It's an old cliché' but EVERYONE in prison is innocent. You and I, of course, know better.

This brings me back to our relationship with both Tim Mann and Susanne Friend. The same faith that led me to quit my job also led me to purchase their training manual. At first, I had no idea why. I had some passing knowledge of aquaponics but not enough to speak intelligently on the subject by any means. My academic studies focused on constitutional law, self-defense policies, weapons training and deadly threat assessment practices. Again, I had no idea why I was being led to purchase this training material offered by Mr. Mann and Ms. Friend. Over the course of 2013, my faith continued to be rewarded (my wife and I were able to graduate a 12th grader and our oldest daughter is currently attending college, out of state) and God continued to grow me as a person, outside of who I had been behind a badge for the previous decade plus. I have no reservations at all saying I believe that I had a true "Saul to Paul" conversion experience during this time. No longer would I be enforcing or equipping others with the tools to enforce/adjudicate the law but rather I would be demonstrating through my talents why the very spirit of the law is and should be our target goal in dealing and living with one another. To love, protect, provide for and equip others with the ability to help themselves for no reason other than they are suffering and need help. I believe with the proper training and insights, that I can affect that very change in my local community. I believe it so much that I've bet my life, family and career on it, Judge Kobayashi.

The charges against Tim and Susanne are very serious. I am a very firm believer that the punishment should indeed fit the crime. I also am a very firm believer in second chances, given the right environment and circumstances exist to ensure success for all involved. I believe these conditions exist with regard to the both of them. Their livelihood, or rather, their life's work produces fruit, both figuratively and literally, to be sure. If not, I would not be writing you now. Tim Mann and Susanne Friend could not have coerced my actions because they don't know me. No, Judge Kobayashi, I am writing because my faith moved me to do so. I seek neither favor nor reward for my words here. I seek only to follow God's will for my life. That may sound fanatical to some but it is my truth and it is all I have to offer you. I simply believe that with their expertise, their caring approach to their craft and their ideals of sharing what they know, how they've learned it and what it can bring to humanity as a whole, that I can bring God's will in my life to it's fullest realization.

Based on your decision I will seek to attend Tim and Susanne's Internship Training Program in Hawaii over the course of two months as soon as I can arrange my funds and receive their acceptance into the program. Obviously, if they are incarcerated for any length of time, my plans must be altered and I would go back to the proverbial drawing board insofar as what direction God desires me to take. I believe that direction to be with Tim and Susanne and in what they can teach me so I, in turn, can teach others. That is, after all, what I was born to do. My service and my career (all of which I would gladly verify for you upon request or you could confirm through your own research) are testament to this. I do not think any of this is coincidence. I believe there is a reason I feel moved to write to you. To reach out to you and humbly request that

you thoughtfully consider a verdict of probation time that can be served while both Tim and Susanne continue to grow and learn from their missteps in judgment while simultaneously being a teaching instrument to others.

An excerpt from Tim and Susanne's website reads:

"We are looking for people who want to change the world, and who are willing to change themselves first. We are looking for people who want to help others by pouring from a full cup, not an empty one. We are looking for family and friends we have not yet met."

These words ring so true to me after the year that I and my family experienced in 2013. I find myself at a very interesting crossroads. Your decision, I believe, stands to serve as the culmination of the very idea that the law is a human institution pre-ordained by God to grow us closer to Him. By allowing these two people to serve their sentence while still working at their craft, justice can be served both to the law and to the spirit.

I believe it with all my heart.

Thank you for your time, Judge Kobayashi.

I work in ocean sciences, as well as software development as it applies to environmental sciences. My recent work focuses on software in support of alternative energy systems, especially power-generating wind farms. I have also done significant work in aquaculture systems design, the study of ocean waves, distillation of fresh water from seawater, and various other areas of ocean-related science and engineering.

I have known Tim Mann for over thirty two years. During that time I have grown to appreciate his focus on environmentally beneficial development work. During the last few years his focus, together with his wife Susanne Friend, and their family, have been on the development of aquaponics. He is the most focused person that I have ever met. He is very intelligent and diligent. He wants many to learn how to raise their own food, practically.



My entire family plays, laughs, and go to the beach and we're always are there for each other and I hope that we will still be able to do all of those things together.



Thank you for taking the time to read what i have witnessed with Tim Mann and Susanne Friend the past months.




### Hello Judge

My name is Debbie Love from Maysville, GA. My family and I own and operate a working farm as well as own and operate a bowling and family entertainment center in Gainesville, GA. My husband and I have been married twenty-three years and we have four children and one grandchild of which three of our children are internationally adopted. All of our children work in our family businesses. I am also a youth basketball coach and a worship leader at our Baptist church.

I am writing this letter to you on behalf of my friend and also mentor in our aquaponics business, Tim Mann. I have known Tim personally for about six months, but I have followed his and his wife, Susanne Friend's teachings and selfless service to this amazing field of being able to grow healthy, nourishing, safe, delicious food for my family, friends, church, and customers for several years. 

I hope that you see that she and Tim have learned from this experience and that you will allow them to stay at home with their children.



Re: Case of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend

My name is Angela Chan and I am a diving instructor and a guest house developer in the Maldives. I found out about Tim and Susanne's situation and hope that this letter would give you more information on the two of them.

I have come to learn about Tim Mann and Susanne Friend in September 2012: Mid August 2012, I stumbled upon a link to Friendly Aquaponics. The information on the website not only aroused my interest in this technology, but the clarity and willingness to share their skills led me to the decision to fly all the way from the Far East, namely Hong Kong, to Big Island, Hawaii; to stay there for 10 days and to do all the courses they offered end of August to early September.

I signed up for all the 3 courses they had at that time: 1 day Commercial Aquaponics training; 1 day Commercial Aquaponics Solar Green House training and 2 days private Aquaponics Technology training. As I was late for the intro course to aquaponics, I had to take private lessons from Tim and Susanne.

Tim and Susanne were both very understanding and supportive of my endeavours. Having lived in the Maldives for over 10 years, I saw and experienced first hand the difficulties in finding fresh, quality produce. I saw this to be a good opportunity to provide cheaper alternatives for the islanders, for myself and for my guests.

Since I would miss the group training on Aquaponics Technology, I read their Table Top system workbook from cover to cover. Even though the 1 day Commercial Training was my first class, I was amazed at the knowledge they have meticulously listed out in their workbooks as I had no problems understanding any of the topics they were covering: they have poured out into the notes what they had learned in aquaponics, the do's, don't's and the don't try's.

When I first met Tim and Susanne in the Commercial Aquaponics Training class, I was struck by their friendliness, their knowledge and the way they made a technical subject easy. They were considerate in all aspects of the course that they even tried out different methods in building the solar green house. Susanne did all the research in complying to the food industry standards and Tim made certain that all materials and structure met building requirements and were economically feasible and sound.



During class, they made sure that I was following them and that I was not too tired due to jetlag. Their children Rose and Jack were helpful and welcoming: that tells you a lot about their parents.

I was fortunate that I missed the group training on Aquaponics Technology. The Maldives is like no other places on earth: the country is made of 1,120 tiny islands in the middle of the vast Indian Ocean. They rely only on rain water for consumption purposes and ground water is merely good for cleaning and washing as the salt content is too high for aquaponics or even drinking. With all these constraints to deal with, I was happy that I chose Friendly Aquaponics as my trainer. Tim not only answered all my questions, but he also anticipated the difficulties which I might have in implementation. He kept nothing for himself and suggested that I, being in a salt water environment, should try growing seaweed, which is healthier and in big demand. Seaweed cultivation was completely new to them but Susanne, a fast learner and excellent researcher, offered their unlimited support and help in my venturing into this new technology.

Seeing the inquisitive nature and their readiness to help others, I understand how they got involved in the problems they are facing right now. They have written me about their situation in detail and realized how and where things went wrong. They cannot but blame themselves for the decision they have made, but the worse was setting a wrong example for their children. They deeply regretted the outcome but life must go on especially when they have dependents and a large aquaponics community - or I should better use the word family - to tend to. Tim and Susanne gave their all to the students and trainees.

Your Honor, I do understand the gravity of the case and that everyone should take responsibility of their own actions. However, I do hope that you would take into consideration their efforts and contributions to the aquaponics industry. Without their untiring pursuit and their generosity in sharing their findings, our careers in this new technology might not have even realized!

Your honor, you have the solemn duty to deliver a verdict on a case affecting a couple that has become very dear to my dreams, Tim and Susanne Mann. As you consider and weigh the issue before you regarding their cases, I wish to humbly share with you what this couple means to me and why I am pleading with you to consider imposing a non-custodial sentence on them (if the law provides you with such an option) instead of sending them to jail

First, let me introduce myself. I am also a law abiding person. I am 51 years of age, married for 24 years and have 4 children, 3 boys and 1 girl. I was born and raised in Africa, but have lived and worked in the USA the last 18 years. Currently, I work in a bank in as a Vice President responsible for monitoring online and mobile customer experiences to ensure we can provide them with the very best banking experience possible. As a young boy growing up in Africa's country side, my parents were farmers. My father was also an agricultural officer responsible for teaching other farmers good agricultural husbandry methods immediately after Kenya's independence. It is that type of a rural farming childhood that bequeathed me with a love for farming and eating fresh well grown food. It also made me keenly aware that the role of farming educators like Tim and Susanne play is critical in families and entire communities overall improvement food security. It may mean whether a family will have food and live or none and starve to death; whether a family will harvest a crop and live peacefully with its neighbors or fight to death for the few crumbs of bread available. A family with the knowledge and technology that Tim and Susanne advances and shares have a better chance to come on the right side of these two vastly different possibilities. As a young boy, I lived with my late dad in an small urban settings for 2 years. I joined the wrong crowd and was smoking cigarettes at a tender age of 12. I failed my elementary exams twice. I learned my mistakes through a lot of pain and turned the corner. 4 years later, I passed my secondary school exams with distinction, was admitted to a premier new school started by Kenya's 2<sup>nd</sup> President. I proceeded to university and graduated with upper 2nd class honors in Economics, Statistics and Computer Science. I quit smoking and never did any drugs. The turning point for my life was a father who never gave up on me and a teacher who gave me a second chance. I pray you do the same for Tim and Susanne. They have learnt their lesson of their stupid action; please give them a chance to proof it

In late 2006, I had just returned to USA after my mother's funeral in Kenya. While grieving her loss — I read a story from our local newspaper, the Winston Salem Journal, about water-based, soilless farming method known as hydroponics. This farming required no weeding which is a major activity and concern for crop farmers. I visited the featured local farmer and was thrilled to find how it is done. However, I found it is difficult for hydroponics farming to to be scaled downwards to a family size or horizontally to adapt in poor country like Kenya with minimal technological footprint. It is the search for an alternative soilless farming that led me to "meet" Tim and Susanne in the internet, and later in person in Tennessee in 2012. After reading and comparing hundreds of articles in the internet, I found they had done the best adaption of Aquaponics. They had come up with solutions would for useful to me here in USA and to poor uneducated poor farmers back in Kenya. They had developed a scalable and adaptable fish-based soilless farming technology known as Aquaponics. However, as I read some of Aquaponics articles and comments from the Aquaponics farming community, I started picking comments Tim and Susanne had been indicted on a "pot" related case. Initially, I thought it was a "smear campaign" from their competitors, but later confirmed that they had indeed broken the law. I also noticed that this couple was deliberately and actively dissuading others reading their newsletters from trying to grow "pot" in Aquaponics. Their response to their mistake and legal predicament was to do all in their power to ensure society have less of their shortcomings and pain; and more of what makes them so special to me and others

In 2011, I wrote my first email to Tim and Susanne. I was inquiring whether they had scheduled any Aquaponics greenhouse training in mainland USA. Susanne replied, and in the process of discussing the mainland training schedule, volunteered the information that they had pending federal case related to growing "pot" – and that its outcome had introduced some uncertainty on their training planning and scheduling. Susanne was very candid about their crime, the prevailing circumstances and most importantly, that they both took responsibility for their actions, they were very sorry and regretted their stupid dumb actions. I expressed my strong disappointment. My hope and prayer is, if the law provides for a non-custodial sentence, that you will consider impose such a sentence to them instead of sending them to jail. I believe they have accepted made a mistake, they have apologized and have undertaken to never again violate the laws of the land. My hope and believe is the society will be better served with them being out of jail and warning others and teaching so many others to do the right farming, than with them serving their time in jail.

In 2012, Randy Campbell hosted Friendly Aquaponic's first Aquaponics solar greenhouse training in Tennessee. Tim and Susanne delivered the training. I spent a week (at least 10 hours per day) with this couple listening and interacting with them up close. This training session had about 30 other attendees who had travelled from across the USA (IA, NY, TX, NC, GA, TN etc). Tim and Susanne's Aquaponics knowledge was deep and freely shared, their solutions were well thought out, simple and cost effective to implement, their passion about healthy foods was almost palpable. Most importantly, I came out of that training with one enduring view of this couple - they are hard working, they have a generous spirit, and they brutally forthright, even when discussing their personal struggles (even though it was not part of the training package) and they have learned a valuable lesson on good citizenship and the importance of the rule of law in a free well functioning vibrant society like USA. On the last hour of that week, out of their own violation, they brought up the "pot story" in front of the entire group. Right upfront, with sheer embarrassment and regret, they clearly stated they made a mistake, that it was wrong and dumb on their part, it was stupid idea done when they allowed the fear of losing their home and business to overwhelm them and that they were really sorry for having done it. I could clearly see the emotional toil this mistake, the arrest and legal process has taken on this couple. Since their alignment, they have suffered a lot of emotional pain for their crime already. It was one of the most painful, really humbling experiences of all the time we spent together that week - to watch such talent and passion shattered by a crime was very moving to me. I believe they have a lot more societal value and utility when they willingly share their story about their "pot" mistake in the open and in the internet, not as heroes or something they are proud about, but as fallen, repentant and fallible human beings. We all can learn from their mistakes and desist from repeating them. Please, if the law allows you to consider a non-custodial sentence, I humbly implore you not to send them to jail. Their crime, story and expertise in a jail will be not heard by free people with the freedom to act and implement Aquaponics to feed themselves or others. Their story when shared in their well attended Aquaponics training sessions openly and when they warn others to not ever try dumb, illegal activities while doing Aquaponics farming is vastly more effective. They have accepted they were wrong, they are very sorry about their actions

This couple is really a key part of the adoption and growth of Aquaponics to a lot of people, not just in USA. Personally, I intend to take their technology to Africa. Others have already taken their technologies to such their countries like China and Honduras in S America. Please, for the sake of Americans adopting their Aquaponics technologies and learning to grow and eat fresh foods grow in their balconies, for the sake of the many hungry and poor Africans who will benefit from the knowledge and research that Tim and Susanne have been doing, for the sake of their young family, please don't send them to jail, if the law provides for you to consider an alternative sentence. Please consider giving them a non-custodial sentence for their crime.

I know some communities in Kenya who fight seasonal deadly wars whose main cause is the shortage of water and food. Aquaponics uses very literal water and produces both fish and crops in a naturally symbiotic manner. Aquaponics is the ideal solution to these Kenyan communities' ever present hunger and famine threat. A significant number of Kenyans are ravished by abject poverty, some have eaten or feed their children dead animals due to famine, and some have died of starvation due to famines. Only last month, a grandmother in a place called Kakuma fed her grandchildren dogs due to hunger – that was the only "food" she could find to sustain the precious lives of her grandchildren. Technology and business is my vocation, but farming is my avocation. Aquaponics offers me the hope and chance to align both my vocation and avocation into one dream. Tim and Susanne are the best Aquaponics innovators and teachers that I have found over the years. They have a generous spirit to share their knowledge very freely – they can help make my dreams come true if they are not in jail. They can help me play a small but important role to make food available to some of the people that need it most - and in cheaper, easier and sustainable manner. If this couple must goes to Jail, I will humbly accept your verdict, but my dream will most likely be delayed and maybe even derailed; my dream of taking this awesome Aquaponics farming technology to my starving fellow Kenyans may be delayed by the length of the term this couple serves time in jail. Please allow them to be "free" to raise their family and contribute to the continued growth and adaption of Aquaponics farming technology that they are so good at researching, adapting, documenting and sharing. Their work will benefits people that though they will never know of personally. Please consider my humble request.

When I received the letter from Tim and Susanne telling us about their legal issues, frankly it came as a shock, but I must say that I was impressed at how open they were in letting Samantha and I know exactly what they had been involved with, how they were taking responsibility for their actions, and how they were truly repentant for making a mistake that can affect a great many number of lives they are responsible for

My wife and I have never been in trouble with the law: between the two of us, we have only ever had two speeding tickets, both of which are decades behind us, so we do not know what it is Tim and Susanne are going through: we can only imagine now ingritering it must be to know that their rate lies with the decision that you make in their sentencing. From what I've been able to learn about you, you are known in the legal community to work with people and get them to resolve matters. And being a neueral duage, if we seem recently the statement that Adomey General End moder made in regards to sentencing of individuals in such matters. "By reserving the most severe penalties for serious, high-level or violent drug traffickers, we can better promote public safety, deterrence, and rehabilitation – while making our expenditures smarter and more productive."

In regards to this specific case, we know that Tim Mann and Susanne Friend are neither violent, nor high-level drug traffickers. They are simply two individuals that got caught up in what they believed to be a legitimate instance of them helping their community

According to the United States Department of Justice, the time spent in prison does not affect recidivism rates.

Low-level and mid-level drug offenders can be adequately prosecuted by the states and punished or supervised in treatment programs, as appropriate. Research has shown that community-based drug treatment is more effective both in economic and social terms than incarceration. Studies have estimated savings from \$10 to \$18 for every \$1 spent on community-based treatment.

I am not a lawyer and I applied if my bringing these items up are offensive in any manner; I am certain you know all of this. The point of me bringing these items up is that they make sense.

What Tim and Susanne did are wrong in the eyes of the law, and they are not attempting to deny this. The item in question is their sentencing, and to place them behind bars will not help them, will be detrimental to their family, their community, and to all of us who depend on them to help us achieve our dreams which are to bring healthy food and socially just businesses to our communities as well.

House arrest, probation, mandatory drug classes; these are all things that will show others in the community and the voting population that your court does not take these offenses lightly, that what Tim and Susanne did was and is illegal, and will help prevent recidivism just as well if not better than a prison sentence would do, and at the same time, still allow them to be productive members of society








This letter is in response to a request by Tim Mann and Susanne Friend of Friendly Aquaponics, Inc. concerning their upcoming hearing before you on February 13, 2014 for the illegal growing of marijuana.

I have known Tim and Susanne since late 2010 when I discovered their website <a href="https://www.friendlyaquaponics.com">www.friendlyaquaponics.com</a> while searching the Web for information on the subject of Aquaponics, of which I knew very little. While going through the archived newsletters to learn as much as possible about Aquaponics, I was struck by how much emphasis there was on the fact that they kept saying "that you cannot grow marijuana in an Aquaponics system" period, "don't even try". Since I wasn't interested in growing marijuana, I couldn't understand why they were putting so much emphasis about it in their newsletters. It wasn't until over a year later that I discovered why when I happened to come across an online article in a Japanese magazine, of all places, about the background and history of Friendly Aquaponics which included their legal problems that came about with trying to grow marijuana.

After inquiring and learning about the circumstances with regards to the reason that they tried growing marijuana, I can relate to the panic that you feel when you are faced with the possibility of losing what you have worked so hard to achieve. Sometimes reason gets thrown out the window and you try to rationalize your inappropriate decisions and actions. I fell victim to the same panic trying to save my business and, although I did not do anything illegal, my bad judgement and decision making resulted in the short-sale of my house and the loss of most of my net worth several years ago. The effects of those decisions test your character and forces you to examine your values and find out what is most important to you. It has taken me much pain and suffering to recover from those bad decisions but recovering I am, in part, due to Tim and Susanne's help even though they may not know it. This is why





I felt compelled to write this letter.

I very much believe Tim and Susanne when they say that they have remorse for their "stupid" decision to try and grow marijuana. In fact it was really stupid and they should be punished for that decision. However, punishment can come in many forms.

It comes from the shame that you feel when you have let your family, friends and loved ones down for the decisions that you have made. It comes from the extra hard work that you have to do to recover from those decisions. More importantly, with Tim and Susanne, it can come in the form of the anxiety you feel of not knowing, for an extended period of time, what is going happen to you when it comes time to go before a judge to learn your fate that will affect you and your family for the rest of their lives.

From my standpoint, I can attest to the fact that Tim and Susanne have shared their knowledge about Aquaponics freely and openly and have been a tremendous help not only to me, but to perhaps thousands of others in the education of Aquaponics farming. Through their "open source" website and the training programs, they have enriched the lives of many people so that they can grow organic food either for themselves or do it on a commercial basis for their livelihood. They have been pioneers in the development of Aquaponics farming and have shared that knowledge without reservation so that this world can have a better chance of food sustainability. In California, where I live, they say we are suffering through a drought not seen in 500 years. Aquaponic farming uses 98% less water than "soil" farming and any help that we can get to better lessen the demand for water is critical for us and elsewhere in the world.

I also believe that Tim and Susanne are very much family oriented and are extremely hard working people. They know what they have done was illegal and they are extremely remorseful for their bad decisions.

The question then becomes, what is the appropriate punishment not only from a legal standpoint but possibly from a societal one as well. I can't answer the legal question because that has to be the decision of the courts. However, from a societal standpoint, I believe society would be much better served if Tim and Susanne could be allowed to continue to do their work to further Aquaponics farming. Perhaps, this contribution to society can be considered when making the legal decision.



I am writing to request leniency in the sentencing of both Susanne Friend and Timothy Mann who have acknowledged guilt in growing martijuana on the island of Hawaii. I have known both Susanne and Timothy since 2010. I first met Ms. Friend and Mr. Mann and their family when I came to Honokaa Hawaii to attend a "Friendly Aquaponics" Commercial Aquaponics Course offered by these two respected farmers. There were approximately 100 ics "valued engineered" Dr. James Rakocy of the University of the Virgin Islands design of recirculating aquaponics system. During the course I remember that both Ms. Friend and Mr. Mann on more then one occasion during their instruction stated that aquaponics should be employed to grow food and discouraged any attempt to use their designs to grow marijuana. 



I also have learned that they could potentially face a lengthy prison sentence.

My knowledge of their personal lives is limited only to my experience of them as promoters of an innovative food production system known as Aquaponics, and how they have helped promote my own involvement in Aquaponics. I feel lucky to have come across their experience as producers in this blossoming industry.

I had spent a couple of years investigating Hydroponics and Fish Aquaculture following the collapse of the financial industry in 2007-2009 and was looking for an opportunity to enter the food production industry as it was developing with a local focus. I became fascinated by Aquaponics, which is a joint venture between Hydroponics and Aquaculture, and I eventually landed on their site, Friendly Aquaponics.com.

I felt they had developed an actual model for entering this emerging local food production model and I began a a series of communications with them, speaking with Tim on the phone and through a series of emails. My name is Warren Anderson. I am currently the Executive Director of the Albanian International School in Tirana, Albania. I am compelled to write a letter of support on behalf of Tim Mann and Susanne Friend to repay only partly all the information, support and encouragement they and their work with Aquaponics have meant to me.

I first read about Tim and Susanne after arriving in Albania six years ago. I read an article about Aquaponics and looked on the internet for more information. Their website and expertise was featured prominently in Aquaponics circles. It was obvious that they were eager to help, explain and mentor those just learning about this new way of sustainable farming. Unlike many of the others, they knew what they were doing from trial and error and were not motivated by the almighty dollar. From the beginning my goal was to attend one of their week-long training opportunities.

My first direct contact with Tim and Susanne was when I attempted to order one of their system manuals. Due to an internet glitch I was unable to complete the transaction, so I called them and left a message complaining. Susanne responded right away, returning my call within hours and the problem was solved with a free manual for my inconvenience.

I continued reading their weekly newsletters while experiencing one of the most difficult times of my life. I had gone to Dubai three years ago to teach only to find that the school really did not want teachers but rather baby-sitters that catered to every whim of spoiled brats. That is NOT how I teach. I left the school and stayed in Dubai due to a friend from college. His promises of starting a business together were just words followed by movement in that direction then nothing.

I was stuck in Dubai with little money, no life and seemingly getting nowhere with no way to leave. What sustained me – seriously – were the weekly Friendly Aquaponics newsletters and the dream of putting their system to work for the good of others but also for profit for myself. I explained the Friendly Aquaponics system to people from Pakistan, the UAE and Myanmar. All were eager to learn more. I also wrote plans for NGO's on how to use the Friendly system for benefit of destitute and starving folks in various Third World countries.

Finally, in June 2013 I was able to attend a Friendly Aquaponics training week in Tennessee. That trip and experience was one of the best I have had in over 20 years. At the training I met great folks from all over the U.S. with a similar goal, to take control of what we eat and how it

is grown and to provide others with the quality food they need and deserve for both profit but also as a service to others. It was very inspirational!

Tim was the trainer at that week-long event, with the assistance of his young son Jack. It was obvious to all that the active and supportive family portrayed and described in the newsletters was the real deal. The way the two worked together, the way Tim talked about Susanne and the rest of the family made evident that this was a family that enjoyed working together and was happy and unified in the Friendly family business. It was a natural team effort.

I am writing because I believe that in this case before you, in my humble opinion, taking either or both Tim and Susanne form their biological family as well as their world-wide Aquaponics family would be a punishment that does not fit the crime. I had read about their legal difficulties and their acceptance of responsibility from Tim and Susanne as well as denigrating remarks from competitors disparaging their work and looking for new customers. Tim and Susanne admitted their actions and clearly warned others not to make the same mistake.

If a punishment must be meted out might I suggest community service. So many more in their local community and throughout the world would benefit and justice would be served as well. It is obvious that their past mistake in judgment has taught them a lesson and that example serves as a warning to anyone else that might be headed the wrong way.

After reading nearly two hundred of their newsletters, corresponding by email and meeting one half of what is obviously a loving and committed family team I believe their commitment to helping others, their integrity in the business and in admitting mistakes - both personal and professional - as well as their love for their children and their desire to be positive examples warrants leniency. I respectfully request the Court to take all the good they have done and can do into consideration.

My name is Wang Xiaocheng. I am now live in Beijing China, working as a brand manager in a Chinese digital map Company, all the iPhones in China using our Company 's digital map. And I work with others in China to get the idea of Aquaponics spread.

In Oct. 2009, I went to Hawaii for a whole year internship program that is when and where I know Tim and Susanne. And I left Hawaii in Oct. 2010 that is when and where I recognize them as my parents, cause the whole year I was living there, they treat me as their own son. I live with them, eat with them, go to the beach with them, celebrate all the festival's with them, I really enjoyed my life with the family and I love everyone in the family. So, I am writing to ask please let the lovely family till be a family, do not take the Mam and Dad away from the family and put them in the jail, left kids and mamaya outside.

And, not only the family need them to be a lovely whole family, the Aquaponics community need them desperately too. They are really the pioneer of this area; they take a big risk to embrace the idea of Aquaponics and tried the best to make it happen before everybody that needs courage. They have a big influence in the Chinese Aquaponics community, they not only teaches most of us how to operate and helped us separate our own system, they also helped to connect the Chinese Aquaponics community, most of us know each other through Tim and Susanne's introduction. Aquaponics is a new area, we really need them to be around to give us ideas with their long-term Aquaponics system operating experience.

In the last, I want to say that I was there when they made the big mistake. We talked a lot about this, they really regretted for what they have done. They were really candid about their mistake and tried to share their experience with me, their kids and others to help us get away from the mistake they have made. Instead of putting them in the jail, I wish you can give them another chance to stay outside to share this experience.

In all, I do think if you can give them another chance to be free, they can do more contributions to the society than being in the jail. If we do not have them free, we will have four young kids and mamaya without taking care of, we will lost a happy family. If we do not have them free, someone like me will never have their chance to learn Aquaponics with them and to experience a American life in a lovely family in Hawaii. If we do not have them free, we will lose someone to help others not get involved in the same mistake they have made. So, please let my American parents free and give them a chance to contribute, not a chance to just regret.

This letter is a letter of character regarding Timothy Michael Mann and Susanne Lenore Friend.

My name is Jerome Jorda, (I am farmer from New Caledonia, I hold an MBA degree from Beijing as well as a Bachelor from LMU in Los Angeles, I work and live in New Caledonia on my farm, an aquaponic farm dedicated to producing organic vegetables). I know Tim and Susanne through a 2 months internship at the Friendly Aquaponics farm on Big Island, and have been familiar with them and their work for a couple of years ever since I started being familiar with Aquaponics.

I know them to be very generous, honest, hard worker, friendly oriented and people friendly. During my stay with them on the farm, we had many people visiting, from friends to family to other interns working on the farm. They are also people who believe in second chances, which for me is a very respectable attribute because it shows their trustworthy character. Tim and Susanne are also very community minded, they like to work with other farmers and they love to share their knowledge and their intense experience in aquaponics. This can be felt in Hawaii since almost everyone on big island knows what Aquaponic is! They are people who are concerned about world events and who want to make a difference by teaching people from the whole world how to grow organic food through sustainable techniques.

I am aware of the events regarding Tim's and Susanne's guilty plea, and I am aware of what has transpired in the restitution they have made in their field of aquaponics, and in their home community, since the day they were arrested. They are publicly very outspoken against breaking the law in any manner, and freely share with others the trouble they have been in because they did not stay on the right side of the law. I truly believe that they have already suffered extensively for their actions. They have lost credibility in the public eye, and I know them to be truly despondent regarding what they have put their family through. They have a good family: they have three children, Jack (age 12), Lucky (age 10), and Rose (age 8), and I know their children to be well-behaved, good-natured, actively working with their parents on the family farm, teaching aquaponics

to other children and very respectful to new people staying in their house. Their children and Susanne's 88 year-old mother are certainly not deserving of what they have been through. Susanne is the sole surviving child for her aging mother, and it is my belief that an extended prison sentence will cause significant harm to the health of her aging mother, Isabelle, who depends upon both Tim and Susanne to take care of her and their home so that Isabelle can live at home instead of moving to a nursing home.

I believe that an extended prison term will serve as a tremendous hardship for their business, which is currently allowing them to teach around 2000 people each year how to grow their own food. They work with churches and non-profits all over the world, and they actively campaign for the care of the poorest among us. They are working very hard on the relocalization of our food supply, especially in Hawaii, where, as I understand, over 90% of all food is shipped in.

Because of the significant difficulties that will be faced by Tim's and Susanne's family, who themselves were blameless in their crime, and because of the great work Tim and Susanne are doing in the world, I would ask for you, the judge, to grant them a sentence of probation so that they can continue their much-needed work, both in their Hawaiian community as well as the broader community of the United States and the world. I believe that the damage to their reputation, and the loss of respect in both their local community, as well as in the worldwide aquaponics community, as well as those freedoms that they were afforded prior to their felony conviction, may have taken a bigger effect than keeping them out of the work force. They certainly will never repeat their offense and, quite frankly, I cannot imagine that they will ever repeat any illegal activity.

My name is Ronald P. Weidenbach and I am Co-Owner of Hawaii Fish Company Inc. (HFC) located on the North Shore of Oahu. Established in 1978, HFC is Hawaii's oldest commercial aquafarm, raising freshwater foodfish for Honolulu's seafood marketplace.

My wife and I met Tim Mann and Susan Friendly at Friendly Aquaponics' first aquaponic workshop in 2008, held at their fledgling family aquaponics farm in Honokaa, Hawaii. This workshop was very well attended by approximately 100 participants and from this initial catalytic event, enthusiasm for aquaponic farming has spread throughout Hawaii.

In the years since this workshop, Tim and Susan have continued to make refinements and add new innovations to their aquaponic systems, have published numerous informative aquaponic newsletters, and have continued to hold aquaponic workshops in Hawaii and elsewhere to share their growing knowledge. Their ongoing educational efforts have provided a very positive and valuable public service locally and beyond.

I have learned that Tim and Susan made the unfortunate decision at some point to try and grow marijuana in their aquaponic system along with their leafy greens and other legal crops. They have since openly admitted their wrongdoing and serious lapse in judgment, and also their remorse in having done so. As Tim and Susan have said, this was the biggest and most regrettable mistake of their lives.

I understand that Tim and Susan's sentencing will be before your Court on February 13, 2014, and that the range of sentencing options available to you are from supervised release to lengthy prison terms. Given that Tim and Susan have readily admitted to this offense and have publically expressed their deep remorse, and given that they are very loving and hands-on parents with several young children, it is my respectful opinion and belief that the public good in this case would be best served by a sentence of supervised relief,. I do not believe that a prison term would serve the community's or their children's best interest in this case.

I wish to add my support to the many who stand behind Tim Mann and Susanne Friend, and their operation Friendly Acuaponics. I regret that I have not yet met Tim and Susanne personally, but I have been in touch with them via email for several years now. I was working as a missionary in Colombia, South America when I first got in touch with them. Working in third world countries and seeing firsthand the poverty and malnutrition in the rural areas made me understand the value of what they are developing. Of course I also saw firsthand the effects of street drugs and their use: the destruction of individual lives, of families, of society, of a country. I cannot, and do not condone their production or usage for anything other than medical conditions as prescribed by a physician. However, one thing that has impressed me about Friendly Acuaponics is how Tim and Susanne have repeatedly stressed that their system is NOT intended for growing marijuana. Indeed they have stated repeatedly in the emails that they send regularly to their subscribers that their systems cannot be used for producing marijuana. I have followed these newsletter emails with great interest, reading every detail that they share both of their acuaponics operation and also the anecdotes of their personal lives. I have just received the 156<sup>th</sup> edition. I fully believe that they are dedicated to their children above all, secondly to developing and teaching a very practical method of farming that has the potential to eradicate malnutrition and hunger in every country in the world. I have been impressed with how quickly they share both their successes and their mistakes. Both in the business sense and in their personal lives as well. Though I haven't yet had the opportunity, I do intend to spend some time with them, work with them, study their operation, and then take it back with me to Colombia and introduce it as a method to compete for poor farmers who can't dream of ever being able to afford acres of land and the equipment needed to farm it.

I do not presume to say what would be justice in this case, but I do not see any merit in a jail term for these people that are seeking to be a help to society and do not pose a danger in any way.

I am currently employed as a Food Service Delivery Truck Driver with previous experience in the mechanical trades. My wife, a retired schoolteacher, and I live in south central Pennsylvania about one hour north of Baltimore, MD. We have both been actively looking for a career that would allow us to stay home on our small farm with the goal of becoming self-sustaining.

After extensive research into the field of aquaponics, we decided to pursue training with Friendly Aquaponics. My wife had been a schoolteacher for 35 years and liked their simple and straightforward training program. We first met Tim, Susanne and their sons, Victor and Jack, at a benefit aquaponics training in the Bronx, New York. This event focused on providing support for people building table top aquaponics systems in apartments as well as converting unused factory buildings for growing fish and vegetables. The training showed how to get a small system up and running and producing fresh food for minimal cost. We were very motivated after meeting Susanne and Tim, as we could tell their ideas were innovative and cutting edge with the potential to have a huge impact by providing food and business opportunities for low income people in the inner city.

After this training, my wife signed up for a further training at a farm in Tennessee, owned by students of Friendly Aquaponics who already had a working system. This was an opportunity to see a larger commercial system in operation that was using greenhouses; the course provided us with all the details to create a commercially viable system in our climate and how to build or adapt greenhouses in an aquaponics application.

I had been unemployed for six months at this time, and with travel and lodging expenses we could not afford for both of us to register. However, I went along to help with the driving and planned to stay in the hotel while my wife attended. Although the training was sold out, when Tim learned that I was at the hotel he made it possible for me to attend. It became very clear to us that Tim and Susanne had a commitment that put people before profits and would do anything they could to help others succeed. It reminded me of the countless hours my wife spent preparing lessons, grading papers and counseling her students. During her teaching career, she was recognized three times in the "Who's Who Among America's Teachers" (a publication which recognizes teachers based on the nominations of successful first year college students who are asked the question "Which teacher has had the most lasting influence on you?"); her fifth grade class also won a national essay contest and had the opportunity to spend a week at Space Camp (Huntsville, AL) with all expenses paid.



Only Tim, assisted by his son, Jack, age 12, presented at the Tennessee training; Susanne and Victor had returned home to care for the other children. During the long days of the 5-day training (the days were long because the participants always voted to have Tim present extra segments), I had several opportunities to speak one on one with Tim and Jack. I was most impressed with Tim's honesty and devotion to his family as well as his attention to the many important details of running these systems and his commitment to getting things done right.

Since our two trainings in June of 2013, my wife and I have purchased all the materials necessary for building a 128 square foot aquaponics system and are planning on beginning instruction this spring as soon as the weather improves.

As a CDL Driver, I am strongly opposed to the use of drugs and alcohol with few exceptions. I used drugs (including marijuana) and alcohol most of my early life. This choice, that started when I was a teenager, has had a very negative impact on all areas of my life and has hurt those close to me. I would agree with a statement I heard recently, as some states have decided to legalize marijuana, that "using marijuana makes you stupid, but you think you're smart."

I believe Susanne Friend and Tim Mann greatly regret their involvement with growing marijuana, not because of the embarassment or financial losses, but because of the bad example they set for their children and the negative impact it may have had on their mission to "spread the word" about aquaponics.

I am hopeful that you will consider all the positive contributions to the world this family has made, and allow them to continue under reasonable supervision without prison sentencing. Before we were aware of the charges against them, at both of the events we attended, Tim and Susanne spoke out against any attempt to cultivate marijuana using aquaponics. They are always very "up front" about their failures as well as their successes and am sure they have already learned a very hard lesson from this experience.

THIS IS THE BEST MANUAL of all the crap that is out on the market. It is a real technical book. And I know what I am talking having a master degree in mechanical engineering from Europe

This is what I wrote to them long before I knew of their problem (I received an email with details only yesterday).

My story:

Born in 1957 in Bucharest (communist) Romania. High school. Mandatory (communist country) 1 yr in the army. Masters degree in mechanical engineering with a specialty in designing, building and/or operating chemical plants (factories).

In 1982 emigrated legally to the US (being of Jewish ancestry), 1982 first job in US=dishwasher (so I know what being poor and desperate means). 1982-1989 going from job to job and from school to school I got to be a licensed master plumber and a licensed general contractor for the state of California and in December 1989 I had a full time job with the LA school district and my construction company on the side. During this period I got arrested for drunk driving and it did not ever happened again.

In Dec 1989 Romania had the bloodiest anti-communism revolution of all East Europe (60.000 people killed) but finally the country was FREE. At that time I was married with a 3 year old daughter. My wife is of Chinese origin from Taiwan and I had to convince her to leave all her family behind and follow me to the other side of the planet. I DID IT and one of the most important arguments was that I told her :ROMANIA IS A DRUG-FREE COUNTRY AND



CHRISTINE WILL GROW AND MATURE IN A DRUG-FREE ENVIRONMENT. This is to explain the position of our family on drugs and is important (I think) considering the last few lines of this letter.

So in 1990 I was back in Romania and little by little I developed over 40 different companies from medical clinics, insurance companies, TV stations, a glass factory, real estate (on a big scale) to agriculture on over 20.000 acres and the biggest freshwater fish farm in Europe (15.000 acres of ponds). At one moment only in the offices I had around 100 people and in the companies over 2000. I did mention all this because it will help me substantiate 3 main ideas:

I know how to "read" people

I know how to "read" a business

Because the businesses were so many and diverse and because in Romania of those times life was going on at a rate of 200miles/hour, what I had to use was "common sense". I think I had it or at least I trained to achieve it.

In 2011 because family issues we decided to return to the USA. As both my wife's parents passed away and because CA was "dead" from the real estate point of view we decided for Texas.

At the end of 2012 all the real estate income was built (so my wife will leave me alone :):)) and I was free to go finish what I started in Romania and did not finish= an organic farm.

And this is how I got to know Susanne and Tim. We NEVER met and we only exchanged 9 emails on technical aspects, but I think that I know them very well from their HUGE website and here are my thoughts:

- A) I think that they are a "whole" both in business and in the family, and in today's times a strong family "brick" (as the base for our society building) and a strong business "brick" are starting to be rare so in my head I consider both of them as one.
- B) In all the pictures and the movies on the website it looks that they raise some fine kids. I know that the movies and the pictures can be deceiving but there are just too many of them and with all the details in the right place that made me think that nobody can be that good (at deceiving).
- C) After 2008 to operate that farm, to write their manuals, to build that HUGE website and to keep classes while you raise 4 kids and run a family I think that all of it just took all their time so no time for "growing" anything else (and also not their wish as they stated in their email and my "reading" tells me to believe them).
- D) I "read" their business from middle to good and that means that they make enough money now for no need to do foolish things anymore.



Good day. My name is Tony Perino and I am a general contractor from the Chicago area. I own several businesses that have to do with construction, development and property leasing and management. I am also the men's ministry leader at Crosswinds Church in Plainfield Illinois.

I have been involved with aquaponics for over three years and have had mixed results on the sincerity and honesty of the different people I have encountered. I built one of Tim and Susanne's systems after a lengthy search to find someone that would put their money where their mouth was. There were several people that only wanted your money, and in some cases a lot of your money, but were not very forth coming with any useable information on their system or the results.

The opposite was the case with Tim and Susanne. The price point was very affordable and the technical support and was available and with quick turnarounds on any emailed questions. They seem to have a genuine desire to educate as many people as possible about the benefits and simplicity of aquaponics even if you have not purchased the affordable plans that they have which is refreshing in a world that is dominated by the attitude of ME, ME.



I believe house arrest so Tim could continue his work or having Tim design and build a system for the Hawaiian penal system would be much more beneficial than a jail sentence. A system for the penal system could have several benefits from a dietary standpoint as well as teaching inmates valuable skills about food production and sustainability.





I am providing this reference on behalf of Tim Mann and Suzanne Friend who have been charged with illegally growing marijuana on their farm.

My wife and I have been operating an insurance and financial services agency together for over 20 years and much like the accused are very familiar with the challenges of maintaining a self-employed livelihood through rough economic times.

I first met Tim when researching information online about Aquaponics as perhaps a second or 'retirement' career. I visited many websites and spoke to many people, but nobody was as generous, honest, and knowledgeable as Tim. That was in August 2013. There is no doubt in my mind this family learned their lesson the hard way and now helps others to not repeat them.

Your Honor, it would be a loss for both the Aquaponic community at large, but certainly for me personally, to not have their expertise available any longer. Not to speak of the loss for the family and his children in particular. I owe him greatly for the difference he made in my pursuit of Aquaponics, and I loathe the uncertainty this provides for my future, knowing I may not have their knowledge and commitment available to me.

My name is Marvin Rethmel, for the past 14 years I have been a Code Enforcement Officer in New York State and come across all types of people some honest and some not so honest.





To err is human and I believe they made a human error.






I would like to ask for a few minutes of your time to express support for Tim Mann and Suzanne Friendly in regards to their upcoming trial in your court.


